### **Vision Screening**

Dear Governors,

I hope you have all enjoyed your holiday.

I hope that you have made progress in your efforts in forming your committees of volunteers to vision screen school age children. We have made some progress and I realize that this is going to take some time to become a full-scale project. The important thing is to keep trying.

It has been brought to my attention that some Lions have been calling Lion Janice Chapman, our KidSight coordinator for preschool vision screening, to get information about the school age children. The KidSight program is an all together different program than the school age Vision Screening program.

The Plus Optic camera is only designed for the KidSight program. It does not test for acuity because acuity requires input from the child.

Please do not confuse the two programs. If you need any help to screen school age children, please contact me or PDG Charlie Short. We will be more than happy to assist you with any information you may need.

Lion Janice should only be contacted for preschool screening. She does not have enough information on the vision screening project to be able to help you.

Please pass this information to your clubs so they will have it when they need it.


