Currently District 25A has 1272 members. LCI requires a District to have 1250 Lions to stay a District. If we reach less than 1250 members you might be reading this in the Future.

District 25A 4th and Final Cabinet Meeting MINUTES

DG Who Knows opened the meeting with this announcement:

The delegates at the MD25 State Convention voted to accept the recommendation to eliminate District 25A. This vote was taken due to the decline in membership, having District 25A less than the 1250 members required to be an independent district.

The clubs in the Eastern half of the district will become part of District G and the Western half with District C.

All PDG's will now have the designation "from District A" added to their introductions, to indicate difference from those who are really from District C or G. Trustees who represent District A on a State Project terms have ended as of the vote. You will be able to run for an office at the next District Convention in your new District.

All clubs banners, letterhead, and any other items will need to be changed to your new District's initial.

All 25A funds will be transferred to your new Districts, splitting it 50/50. The Ed Paine and DR funds will be transferred to the Districts and decided by the Cabinet where those funds will be allocated. Programs supported by District 25A will no longer be funded. Eye Glass Recycling and Missions might be transferred to a different District. The program at the Westville Correctional Facility will be terminated.

The current VDG and 2nd VDG, if desire, will need to run for the position of 2nd VDG at their next District Convention.

Some of the changes your club might incur are an increase in District dues. The Districts will need to increase the budget for the DG and VDG's due to the increase travel distance and hotel stay for club visitations/events over 80 miles. The CS/CT duties will increase and extra funds will be needed. District 25A has the lowest dues, so your dues WILL increase.

District 25A has always been an outstanding District. We were recently recognized by the International President for our outstanding District Convention and growth in membership. It is up to each of us to insure we keep our independence; all we need to do "is ask...."

If you think is not real, ask the former District E2 members.

Join the Lions in Milan!

The 102nd annual Lions Clubs International Convention will be in Milan, Italy, July 5 – 9, 2019. The Indiana delegation will be marching in the Parade of Nations on Saturday July 6th and the parade route winds among beautiful historical buildings ending up in the square where the unique masterpiece of the Milan Cathedral stands. The Milan Cathedral or Duomo di Milano in Italian, is the cathedral church of Milan, Italy. Dedicated to Saint Mary Nascent, it is the seat of the Archbishop of Milan. The Gothic cathedral took nearly six centuries to complete.

Italian Culture - a brief overview of Italian customs and traditions.

Italy is home to more than 62 million individuals as of 2017 and is ranked 23rd in population size when compared with other countries throughout the world. Italian culture is steeped in the arts, family, architecture, music and food. Home of the Roman Empire and a major center of the Renaissance, culture on the Italian peninsula has flourished for centuries.

Family is an extremely important value within the Italian culture," Talia Wagner, a Los Angeles-based marriage and family therapist. Their family solidarity is focused on extended family rather than the West's idea of "the nuclear family" of just a mom, dad and kids, Wagner explained. Italians have frequent family gatherings and enjoy spending time with those in their family. "Children are reared to remain close to the family upon adulthood and incorporate their future family into the larger network," said Wagner.

The Euro is the currency there and currently is worth more than the US dollar (\$1.14 Euro versus \$1 US). You may want to check with your bank to see if it provides a better exchange rate than what is offered in Italy. While credit cards are accepted at all of the larger stores and restaurant, the smaller and individually owned businesses may only deal in cash. Also, the culture in Europe is that tips are not to be added onto the bill.


Michiana Lions Meet Community Needs in January.




