

Referring Vision Care Patients from Your Lions Club to National Vision Providers

If a person over six years of age is found to need referral for vision care assistance, and is eligible under financial or other criteria:

The responsible Lion from the local club discusses generally with the patient, parent, or guardian when they would be available to attend an appointment.

The club member contacts the district vision chair for an approved appointment voucher. This voucher is held by the store and is not released to the club or district. Clubs must contact their vision chair, not the store.

The district chair coordinates the week of service and location most convenient to the patient and calls the patient, parent, or guardian for their agreement.

The patient, parent, or guardian then calls the store to make their appointment, attends it, and receives treatment.

District Chairs report the number and location of appointments to the State Vision Services Chair monthly. The State Chair then makes an assembled statewide report to National Vision to ensure compliance with the agreement and advise Council of activity.

America's Best stores are wholly company owned and referrals will have no co-pay to the club. Eyeglass World stores will have a small (\$40) co-pay for the examination, as their optometrists are independent providers, and not employees of National Vision.

Both America's Best and Eyeglass World stores make their glasses in house. Same or next-day service is possible, but glasses can take up to three days.

There is no written application for service, as Lions cannot retain a patient's personal identifiable information under Federal law. We can only retain the number of referrals to a given location and the name of the referring club.

Indiana Lions Vision Services adds National Vision Corporation as Provider January 21, 2024

The Lions Clubs of Indiana and National Vision Corporation, owner of the America's Best and Eyeglass World brands, are partnering to help increase the supply of eye exams and glasses to Lions-referred patients. This will help increase treatment available to low-income children and adults screened by Lions vision screening programs.

Under this agreement, all twenty-seven America's Best and Eyeglass World stores will provide three to five appointments a week per store. Patients are referred from area Lions Clubs through their district vision services chairs to the closest available National Vision location.

Qualifying patients will meet Lions qualification of 200% of household federal poverty line, be at risk for loss of work, are enrolled as a student, or have significant personal safety risk due to uncorrected vision.

Patients will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Club referral to the eye care stores will be coordinated by the Lions district vision chairs. There will be no charge to patients for exams or glasses provided under the agreement.

Indiana Lions Clubs provide pre-school and school-age vision screening programs in cooperation with local school health professionals, pre-school administration, and Head Start programs statewide. Since the inception of these programs in 2008, Indiana Lions have screened over 1.3 million children.

Lions Clubs International is the world's largest public service organization with over 1.4 million members in 210 countries. 8500 Indiana Lions serve Hoosiers from over 350 local clubs.







The Dr. Richard T. Miyamoto Fellowship



Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing has established the Miyamoto Fellowship to honor Lions and others for their dedication to their Lions Clubs, to Lions Clubs International, and to those in need in their communities around the world. ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their *junior* year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana;
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Verification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.
