This started out as a weekend for the blind and visually impaired students and adults to give them the opportunity to do things they normally don't get a chance to do. After, spending a Saturday with the Fishing for Life group, I can remember one of the reasons for joining Lions. It's to make a difference in somebody's life. Watching a visually impaired person bait their own hook, cast their fishing pole, reel a fish in, and the excitement on their faces and the people around them is priceless. Talking to some of the students' parents they were extremely grateful to the Lions for having this program. One of the parent's said his son wanted to join the local Lions club where they live and that he would join too.

Our Lions built a permanent shelter on Lions Butch and Rhonda Weston property this Spring. They now have a bathroom, shower, a sink and two refrigerators to make things easier during the event. There was also, horseback riding, a paddleboat, a miniature train and Lion Butch hooked a trailer to the tractor and gave people a hay ride. There were over 40 Lions, 12 Leos, and 16 clubs represented, either they helped build the shelter, or helped out during the weekend.

After observing, and listening to the students, I understand when our Lions say they learn more from them then they do from us. What a remarkable experience, and thanks again to Lions Butch and Rhonda for the use of their property.

Mill Creek Lions are nuts about Walnuts



"My back hurts" was heard at the Mill Creek Indiana Community Lions Club October 2013 meeting. Area squirrels were asking each other, "Where are all the walnuts in the area?"

Club members picked up over 66,000 pounds of walnuts and delivered 38 pickup truck and three cattle trailer loads to Niles Michigan where they were hulled and purchased by the Diamond Walnut Company. These walnuts are then delivered to Missouri where they are shelled for walnut meats.

Funds from this project are used to supplement club dues expenses. There are 47 club members. This club was charted in October 2004. We have been collecting walnuts for four years.
