



President Rosevear introduced speaker, local author, Sandra L. Young. Sandra moved to LaPorte County in 2001 to serve as Executive Director of the Healthy Community Initiative. In that position, she grew the organization to encompass tobacco control, landing a large ongoing state grant, and the Covering Kids & Families Insurance Program, plus overseeing the Drug Free Partnership. After eleven years, she became Vice President of the Unity Foundation leading grant and scholarship processes and collaborating with community coalitions. She retired early to pursue her love of writing fiction and in February, published her first novel, Divine Vintage, based in Michigan City's Uptown Arts District and LaPorte County and featuring many local historical landmarks and buildings though not referring to them by name. It's up to the reader to figure out the association. It is a historical mystery involving social justice. In 1913, a young woman, Tess Burton, moves to Michigan City and opens Divine Vintage, a clothing boutique. While modeling an Edwardian era elegant gown, her mind is opened to a century-old murder. Thus follows visions, disputes over local lore and aided by the murder victim's clothing and diary, a growing list of murder suspects!

Sandy believes authors have a unique opportunity to enlighten and educate people positively about social issues. A pivotal character in the plot of Divine Vintage is a homeless veteran with PTSD.

Besides being active in community theater and singing, she is president of the Arts in the Park concert series and past president of the LaPorte Service League.

She has a huge collection of vintage clothing and accessories which she wears in many community theater productions. They are also featured on characters in Divine Vintage. For the Lions Club meeting, she wore a vintage suit, hat, gloves and jewelry from the seventies. She also featured a display of vintage clothing items and accessories which Lions members examined while waiting in line to purchase signed copies of Divine Vintage.

During the Q & A session, Sandy shared that she was the first Lady Lion in the Decatur, Illinois club.

President Rosevear presented her with a Lions Club banner in thanks for her delightful presentation.





Indiana Lions Foundation Indiana State Fair Project Information



The 2022 Indiana State Fair begins July 29th and runs through August 21st. As last year, the Fair will be closed on Mondays and Tuesdays. State Fair management has decided to close gate 18, so we will have only gates, 12 and 1W this year, but we have added a new position of "stamper" at each gate.

The website is available for you to sign up. To register, please visit the State Fair signup page on the Indiana Lions Foundation website at IndianaLionsFoundationMD25.org.

If you did not work last year, there are several changes that include our new parking situation. You may now enter gate 10 (northeast corner of the fairgrounds) and park as close to the large white maintenance building as possible. You will find our check-in booth on the west side of the maintenance

building in one of five small buildings. Our banner will hang above our booth. The bank is located in that same group of buildings, so we will not have to go upstairs to get money.

There are four shifts available this year. The start time listed for each shift is the time you are expected to check in at our booth. These times have changed from previous years.

- 5:30 am-8:30 am Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
- 8:00 am-2:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
- 2:00 pm—8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 2 W.P. Woods credits.
- 4:00 pm-8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.

We have more than 800 shifts to fill and would appreciate all the help you can give the Foundation.

Here are descriptions of the positions so you will know what to expect.

Seller: This position is inside the air conditioned buildings and is selling tickets.

Monitor: Watches over the automated ticket machines and helps people use the machine when needed and directs their attention to those machines if they want to use credit cards. The monitor will check out money from the bank and keep it in the sellers building. On rare occasions the monitor might be asked to sell tickets from outside. This does not happen very often. This position is outside, but the Fair promised we would have shade this year.

Scanner: Works outside under a tent with several large fans to help keep it cool. As customers present tickets the scanner needs to use the hand-held machines to verify the tickets.

Stamper: The stamper is positioned at the exit and stamps the hands of those wishing to be readmitted to the fair. This is a sitting outside position. The Fair assured me there would be shade.

entire ceremony a truly fun and humorous event.


