Just Call

As we approach the end of the Lions year, we often see a drop off in membership due to the fact clubs drop members who have not paid their dues. Since LCI bills clubs based on their membership rolls on June 30, club officers (rightfully) don't want to be billed for those members who haven't yet paid their dues. However, history has shown us that many of the members we drop are reinstated shortly after July 1. I'm not exactly sure what the number is who are dropped and reinstated but it's a sizeable number. Now if you're a club officer I'm not sure I blame you. You send out the dues statement every year and when people don't respond to their dues payment, we simply drop them figuring they will just be reinstated when they do pay.

This year, with the emphasis on membership, I'm asking you to take another approach. JUST CALL. In fact, we should take a more proactive approach rather than simply dropping them. We should take a hierarchical approach.

- 1. Call any member who hasn't yet paid their dues. People respond to a personal phone call. You could also take the time to reinforce in them how valuable they are to your Lions Club. If they assure you they will pay and still the payment is not there on time, TRUST THEM and keep them on the rolls.
- 2. Text them. We have cell phone numbers for the vast majority of our members. In fact, many people prefer to get information by text and are responsive to that. Texting ranks ahead of the next method I'll mention here.
- 3. Email. Believe it or not, most people respond to texting faster than email. But everyone has their unique take on this, so you need to try emailing also. Sometimes emails get lost in inboxes. I know I get a ton of junk mail and tend to respond to text messages more quickly. But to each his own.
- 4. Offer an alternative way to pay. I know this year with my own Club, I paid with Zeffy. Zeffy is an online payment system that is free to the club and free to the payor. It's quick and easy. You get a unique QR code that the member scans and then BINGO, you're paid.
- 5. Presidents, Treasurers, Secretaries and Membership Chair talk to each other. Maybe the Club Secretary knows this person better and will respond to them quicker. Also, maybe when two or more club officers try to contact them, they'll get the message. So, try more than one officer.

I'm very proud of District 25-A this year. We have 7 districts in the State of Indiana and District 25-A is one of only two districts that are plus in net membership. We are up 33 members year to date. So, take a bow, all clubs, and keep up the good work.

Notes from the Editor: Newsletter Submissions

With an entire year under my belt (or computer) editing our newsletter, I have some notes for everyone on how to successfully submit images and articles. In addition, the Hoosier Lion has specific requirements for submissions to them, so consider those the same as my own. These notes are not meant to be negative; the goal is to help clubs get their work and service into the newsletter without error, omission, or reduction in quality.

<u>Receipt of Articles</u>: Make sure that first and foremost, that I have emailed you that your article, images or flyer were received. If you don't hear from me, I don't have it.

<u>Deadline</u>: That's the most common question. I take things until the last week of the month. The newsletter is approved by the District Governor, which means a few late articles get in while the DG is reviewing the content.

<u>Repeating Articles:</u> I check the date of the event and repeat them all the way up until the start of that month. You can still remind me to repeat your event for the next month or so.

<u>Importing, opening articles:</u> The goal is to make sure that I have received every submission and that each picture or article can be opened and imported into the format that is being utilized. We'll split this topic into categories of can use, can't use, and preference.

<u>Can Use:</u>

- <u>Can use</u> for images: Any PDF, jpg or gif format for images.
- <u>Can use</u> for articles: Any doc file or PDF. Excel is ok for data tables or calendars.

Can't Use:

- <u>Can't use</u> for images: PNG or HEIC. If you send a PNG or HEIC, I'll convert it to a screenshot, which reduces the quality of the image.
- <u>Can't use</u> for articles: PNG. Same as above, I convert it to a screenshot.

Preference:

- Articles or images should be sent as an attachment.
 - If you put any text, image or flyer into the body of your email, it may be overlooked. I do keep emails for a few months, and I recheck each email for content. As I have missed at least two articles or flyers this year, it's important that your hard work and service is recognized.

Thanks to everyone who submits to the newsletter! I enjoy reading each club's submissions and plan to continue this role for the next year.
