District Membership

As promised during the last cabinet meeting, contest winners are listed below with a "*" (along with 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} places).

Unfortunately for you all, I'm kind of a numbers guy so here goes some information. Of all the Lions in our District, 40 Lions (3.11% of our membership) sponsored a new Lion. 13 of those Lions (32% of the 40 or 1% of our overall membership) accounted for over 52% of the new Lions.
