

THE BLIND SOCIAL CENTER

Speaking of the District Convention on March 9, The Blind Social Center and Rehabilitation will have a table at the Convention. Stop by the table and talk to Tony and Connie Blair about that the Center is all about. The Lions Club International Foundation recently gave a \$74,600 matching grant to the Center to help furnish the interior. Notice I did say MATCH. The Lions (and private donations) need to match the \$74,600 and the LIONS must raise at least half of that amount or \$37,300. We are doing well in fundraising (with big Kudo's to the Crown Point Lions Club for their \$5,000 (that's not a typo) donation to the Center. It would be nice if other clubs or could come close to matching that but donations in any amount are appreciated. But WOW CROWN POINT LIONS, you really did a great job. Thanks again.

But first, why is the Blind Social Center important to us. First, blindness is one of our Global Causes in fact probably the Global Cause we are most known for. Blindness is debilitating and whether you are born blind or lose your sight from something like Diabetes or Glaucoma, it is difficult to have a productive, social life. But there is hope -through Rehabilitation. And there are only two Blind Rehabilitation Centers in Indiana, one in Evansville and one in Indianapolis. So this is the only Center in Northwest Indiana. Chances are you know somebody who is blind and no matter where you live, no matter your club, this Center is for them—AT NO COST.

So come see us at the Convention so we can get you materials to get to your club.

Special Report:

Children's Eye Foundation of AAPOS Selects Indiana Lions as Partner

The Children's Eye Foundation of the American Association of Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus (CEF/AAPOS) and Indiana Lions Vision Services have agreed to partner and provide expanded vision care opportunities for Hoosier children.

This is the first statewide Lions partnership for CEF/AAPOS.

Under the terms of the agreement, CEF/AAPOS All Children See program will start accepting qualified referrals for pediatric ophthalmic care from the Indiana Lions' vision screening programs.

Children under eighteen years of age and either uninsured or underinsured would qualify for no cost or reduced cost care. This includes ocular surgery and other treatments for pediatric eye conditions.

Megan Pfefferle, Executive Director of CEF/AAPOS said, "The Lions of Indiana are simply amazing. They provide tens of thousands of free vision screenings per year to schools and preschools already. This screening makes early detection possible, so our two programs are a natural fit. They find kids that may need help, our doctors can diagnose them, CEF/AAPOS helps eliminate the cost barriers to care, and the kids get into treatment."

Charlie Short and Henry Rodriguez of the Indiana Lions both expressed how important the new partnership is. "Indiana Lions have worked to help the blind and visually impaired for over a hundred years. Now we have a national professional association's foundation as a partner. It's just terrific." said Rodriguez.

"Indiana is the first statewide Lions partnership for CEF/AAPOS and we couldn't be more pleased." said Short. "Bringing two large-scale organizations together to accomplish more is always a good thing, but when it's such a natural alliance, it's just like meeting a great new friend. We're all excited to get going."

With a visit by Door Village Lions Dennis Fischer and George Morley to Riley Elementary School last week the club's annual Operation KidSight Project came to a close for the 2023/2024 school year, and by all measures was a complete success with 1150 kids tested since the project was under taken just a few years ago. The significance of that testing is that approximately 115 kids with treatable eye conditions were referred to doctors who can prevent permanent eye conditions when treated before age six.

Lion Dennis chairs this project and guides each facet of it, following the guidelines developed by Indiana Lions Eye Bank, Inc. A program they developed and promote statewide. The guidelines are detailed and include such things as authorization release forms for the parents to sign and other privacy requirements in marking and handling of test results. School administrators and staff support the testing enthusiastically, in fact Mellissa Potts, Health Assistant at Riley Elementary said "we are so pleased that the Lions are doing this, it is such a critical need, and the school health system is not presently set up with these advanced cameras, so it's a win-win for everyone when Lions fill the need so efficiently".

Many club members are involved with the testing because there are so many schools and Day Centers that are visited each year, but all members are delighted to be involved in this project which has such far reaching effect on so many children here in La Porte, and throughout the state.

Administrators in all three schools explained to Lion Cindy Fischer that funds in this budget item are depleted long before the school year ends, and that without the Lions donated supplies, projects teachers want to bring to their classrooms would not continue throughout the end of the year.

Consequently, the supplies the lions purchase and bring to each school are very much needed and appreciated. In fact Mrs Doty, principal at Riley Elementary told Lion George Morley "If the Lions were not able to furnish these supplies, teacher initiated projects for the classrooms would come to an end far too soon before the school year ended, and that is why she, and the teachers, appreciate the supplies so very much".

Lion George assured her that members will be pleased to hear what she said and he would be sure to let them know.

In fact Lion members have a strong interest in supporting schools in the local area, as proven by four of our ongoing annual projects. First, the one described above, donating supplies; second, purchasing and presenting the Lions Special Dictionary to every third grader in the three schools; third, purchasing and presenting first grade readers, (a choice of ten different titles) to each first grader in the three schools; and fourth, Lion members visit each of these schools and test each Pre-schooler with the Lions Special KidSight Camera which detects amblyopia (lazy eye), and other eye conditions that can be treated if caught early enough.

Club members are pleased to present these projects and are happy that the funds they work for are able to fill such worthy community needs, and also, fulfilling the Lions motto, "We Serve".

Indiana Lions Vision Services adds National Vision Corporation as Provider January 21, 2024

The Lions Clubs of Indiana and National Vision Corporation, owner of the America's Best and Eyeglass World brands, are partnering to help increase the supply of eye exams and glasses to Lions-referred patients. This will help increase treatment available to low-income children and adults screened by Lions vision screening programs.

Under this agreement, all twenty-seven America's Best and Eyeglass World stores will provide three to five appointments a week per store. Patients are referred from area Lions Clubs through their district vision services chairs to the closest available National Vision location.

Qualifying patients will meet Lions qualification of 200% of household federal poverty line, be at risk for loss of work, are enrolled as a student, or have significant personal safety risk due to uncorrected vision.

Patients will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Club referral to the eye care stores will be coordinated by the Lions district vision chairs. There will be no charge to patients for exams or glasses provided under the agreement.
