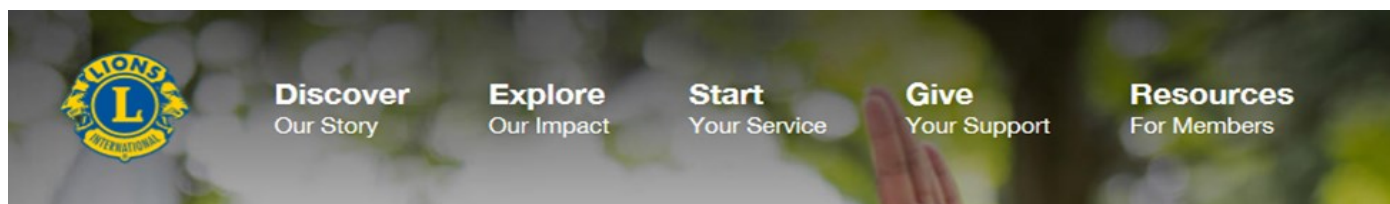

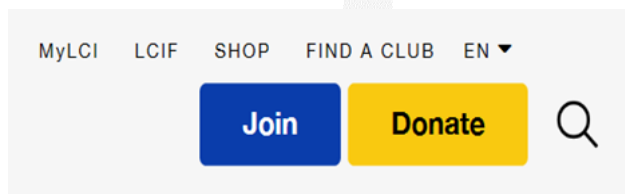

Membership Date of Birth Change

To improve security when verifying the identity of a member, LCI is asking each new Lion for their complete birthdate - not just their birth year. You will no longer be able to complete new membership information on MyLCI without it.

The birth dates for current members are showing as January 1 of their birthyear. **For a birth year of 1951, the birth date is 1/1/1951.** Although LCI says that correcting the birth date is optional for existing members, the MyLCI webpage is not behaving. So it will be necessary to update this information for all Lion club members.

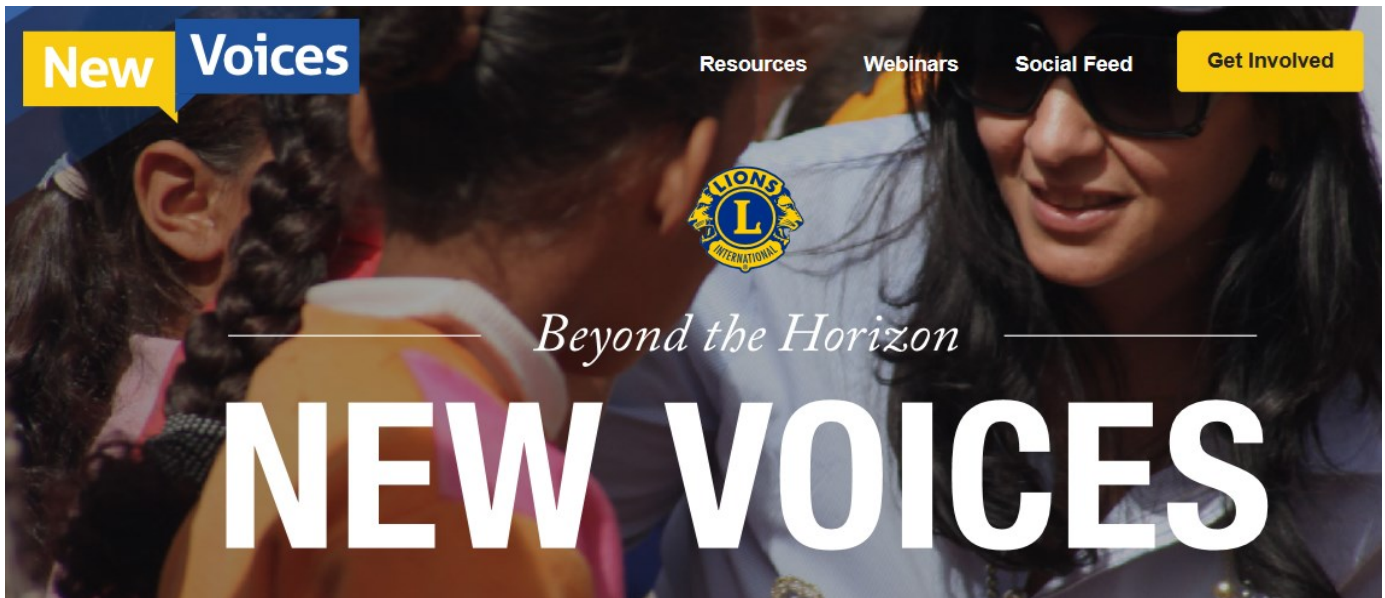

She went on to say, "I don't know if you realize what you've done for us...I don't know if thank you can ever be enough...but that's all I have to give along with prayers for you and your family, that God keep and bless you always."
