Sagamore of the Wabash

Lion Bill Jarvis, a member of the Schererville Central Lions Club, was recently awarded the Sagamore of the Wabash Award by the State of Indiana and Governor Pence. It was presented to him by State Representative Hal Slager. This award is the highest honor the state governor can bestow and is a tribute to those who have rendered a distinguished service to the State of Indiana.

Lion Bill is the Executive Director of the Tri-Town Safety Village in Schererville. The Safety Village was started as a facility to teach children about law enforcement, fire, railroad and street crossing safety. Since 2010 when Lion Bill was asked to serve as Director, it has grown dramatically. Participation has sky-rocketed from 300 students from six schools to about 4,200 students from forty schools. Lion Bill has also expanded the program itself, incorporating electric and natural gas safety as well as developing summer tutoring activities and programs for disabled children.
