LCIF Report PDG Randy Greer LCIF Coordinator

Campaign 100 has raised over 225 million dollars, with a goal of 300 million by June 30, 2022. This is remarkable since we have been in a pandemic for the last 19 months.

LCIF has given out 379 covid-grants for 6.5 million dollars. They have also given out grants for Hurricane Ida, victims of forest fires out west, and Tropical Storm Nicholas that hit the gulf states, many people in Louisiana were without power before the storm hit. A Lion's District in these areas are eligible for a \$10,000 emergency grant.

PDG Patty Cooke and I would like to come to your club and talk about the great things that LCIF does. We can tell you how much your club or members in your club have in their account. 65% of the money raised in our district last year was by individual Lions like yourself.

Individual Lions are the lifeblood of LCIF. We have pledge cards for Campaign 100 that you can make a donation either once a year, every month, or even have it taken out of your paycheck. The pledge is for three years. For as little a \$10 a month you will have donated \$120 a year and \$360 for three years.

We would like to have 100% club participation in donations this year. Even a small donation would help. Contact PDG Patty Cooke or PDG Randy Greer for help and any questions about LCIF or Campaign 100.


TWO SERVICE PROJECTS
