

I'm devoting this month's newsletter article to ask you to support The Blind Social Center. (TBSC). TBSC is having a *Dining in the Dark* fundraiser on October 20 at the Inns Brook Country Club at 6701 Taft St. in Merrillville, IN from 5-9 PM. 1stVDG Patty and I are going. But I'd like to start with a story of my youth. When I got hurt in Vietnam, I recuperated at Fitzsimons Army Hospital in Denver. Part of my rehabilitation took place every week in the snowy months at the Winter Park Handicap Ski Program where the volunteers taught me to ski. When my rehab was over, I decided to "pay it forward" and volunteer at the Handicap Ski Program. Because of schedules, I taught the blind on Sunday's during ski season.

Part of the training was transformative. Trainers stopped us mid-mountain, told us to pull our knit ski caps down over our eyes and ski to the bottom. But with our ski caps over our eyes, we were totally, though temporarily, blind. I can't tell you how much emotion I felt. It still sticks in my mind even almost 50 years later. The first thing I had to learn was trust, trust in my instructor who was verbally telling me where to turn. I felt like I was barreling down the mountain. After a minute my instructor asked me to stop and lift my cap. I had gone just a few feet. The instructor told me to pull my cap back over my eyes and "go faster". Against all my better instincts I found the fall line and proceeded down the mountain. I was amazed at how much other senses had picked up. I could sense the fir trees by their fragrance, The cold was biting at my cheeks. I could hear the excited skiers on the mountain all around me. Were they very close? I couldn't see them to know for sure. Again, trust the instructor. Finally, I was on flat ground again and the instructor told me to life my knit cap. Thank God I could see again. I tell you this because if you're reading this you don't know what its like to be blind. TBSC's Dining in the Dark fundraiser will give you the opportunity. TBSC is the only blind rehabilitation center in Indiana north of Indianapolis. Clients learn mobility skills that help them become more independent and a more productive member of society. Clients will come mostly from our own District 25-A. TBSC started in 2014 and its new home is currently under construction in Gary.

For many years, the Lions of Indiana have studied the Hoosier Lion. Multiple surveys have been conducted and various models from other states have been considered.


The 2023-24 Council of

The Dr. Richard T. Miyamoto Fellowship



Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing has established the Miyamoto Fellowship to honor Lions and others for their dedication to their Lions Clubs, to Lions Clubs International, and to those in need in their communities around the world. Dr. Richard T. Miyamoto retired as Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the Indiana University School of Medicine. At Riley Hospital, he served as Medical Director of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology.

In the 1980's, a grant from Speech and Hearing was provided to Riley Hospital and Dr. Miyamoto to expand the use of cochlear implants for children. Dr. Miyamoto's pioneering work has been recognized around the world, and he continues his close relationship with the Lions of Indiana.

A handsome plaque has been designed to honor the recipients of the Miyamoto Fellowship. For a \$500 donation to Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. within a two-year period, one plaque may be ordered in the recipient's name to be presented by the donor Lion or Lions Club. There is no charge for the plaque. Please contact any Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing trustee in your district for information or to order a plaque.



ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their junior year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana:
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Verification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM – APPLICATION PROCEDURES INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.

The application and all supporting documentation should be forwarded to an ILSH Trustee. Supporting documentation should include a recommendation for the applicant.

In 2022-2023 they gave out over 1,400 Grants for a total of 40 million dollars. LCIF gave out over 14 million dollars in grants for Humanitarian Services, and over 7 million dollars in grants for Disaster Relief last year alone.

In District 50, (Hawaii), they have received much needed grant money for the Maui Wildfires. The fires have burnt most of the town of Lahaina to the ground. More grant money will be allocated when applied for. The Lions in Hawaii have set up a task force and are accepting much needed food and supplies. Grants also have been given out to the earthquakes in Morocco and Turkey.

Our District has been busy filling out Melvin Jones Fellowship applications, 8 of them so far have been completed and several more are on the way. I will have the honor of presenting several in the month of October. If your club wants to know if they are eligible, or how much money they have in their LCIF account, please contact 1st VDG Patty or myself. We now have Credit Transfer Release Forms. These forms are for individual Lions who would like to transfer their money in their personal LCIF account into their clubs account. This could then be used obtain a Melvin Jones Fellowship. We will have these forms available at the Cabinet Meeting on October 22nd.


