

Mission and Vision Leader Dogs for the Blind's mission is to empower people who are blind or visually impaired with lifelong skills for safe and independent daily travel. Their vision is for every person who is blind or visually impaired to travel safely and independently.



Programs and Services During my visit, I learned about the various programs and services offered, including:

- **Guide Dog Training**: Matching clients with highly trained guide dogs to enhance mobility and independence.
- **Orientation and Mobility Training**: Teaching clients to navigate their environments confidently using white canes and other tools.
- **Summer Experience Camp**: A unique program for teenagers to build confidence and learn essential skills.

Highlights of the Visit One of the most memorable moments was meeting the dedicated staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to support the clients. Their passion and commitment were truly inspiring. I also had the chance to interact with some of the guide dogs in training, witnessing firsthand the incredible bond between the dogs and their trainers.

Innovative Initiatives Leader Dogs for the Blind is continuously evolving to meet the changing needs of their clients. They are currently focusing on creating an accessible workspace that embraces diversity, inclusion, and accessibility. <u>This initiative aims to foster innovation</u>, collaboration, and excellence within the organization1.

Community Impact The impact of Leader Dogs for the Blind extends far beyond their immediate community. By providing essential training and support, they help individuals regain their independence and confidence, leading to a better quality of life.



Looking for an Easy and Meaningful Club Project to Promote Civics? Lions Clubs can help promote civics and citizenship education with a great and easy-to-do project: Liberty Day. You can use Sept. 17 (Constitution Day), Dec. 15 (Bill of Rights Day), March 16 (birthday of Pres. James Madison, major author of the Bill of Rights), or any day that works well for your club or your community.

Schools are giving increased attention to Civics classes. Clubs can distribute pocket US Constitutions to their local schools to use in Civics education, which as we all know is more critical now than ever for our nation. This is a great opportunity to promote Civics education AND the goals of Lionism!

- Pocket Constitutions are available to order from either <u>Amazon.com</u> or <u>Walmart.com</u> for only \$1.00 each. Sometimes local partners such as The American Legion may have copies available.
- Civics education takes place at about the 5th to 8th grade level, so contact your local schools, and arrange to deliver pocket Constitutions for classroom use, or in connection with a Citizenship-related activity.
- As with The Dictionary Project, be sure to attach a sticker or mailing label with your local Lions Club's contact info or web site.
- Report your Liberty Day activities on your Monthly Activity Report.


This year, Tues. Sept. 17 (Constitution Day) is also National Voter Registration Day (generally the 3rd Tuesday of September). Lions Clubs are NOT allowed to actually register voters, but clubs ARE allowed to hand out the standard Indiana Voter Registration Application VRG-7 (State Form 50504, R25, 6/24) which individual voters must then submit to their county voter registrar.
