# Monthly Membership and Service Activity Reports

**Club Secretarys** 

All Lions and Leo clubs are asked to report any membership changes on a monthly basis using the Monthly Membership Report (MMR). Even when there are no changes in membership, clubs should report "No changes for the Month." Monthly reporting ensures accurate statement billing, magazine and miscellaneous mailings, award(s) criteria and other benefits. The Service Activity Report (SAR) provides an important means to measure the worldwide impact of Lions and Leos humanitarian service as well as provide clubs with a variety of tools to monitor their service. When no service activities are performed for a given month, it is not necessary to record any service activity information for that month, however, if you file your MMR, that can be added as an Administrative Club Activity, so there is no reason not to file your SAR. These reports are due at LCI by the last day of each month and can be accessed on the Lionsclubs.org website through the MyLCI tab. District A's goal is to have 100% monthly filing of MMR's and 90% monthly filing of the SAR. If anyone needs help completing these tasks please reach out to a member of your leadership team.

Door Village Lions distributed dictionaries to third graders for the sixth consecutive year. Lions Tom and Irene Konieczny along with charter members Lion George Morley and Lion Gene Flickinger and a rookie Lion Karen Swanson distributed the books to Kingsford Heights, Riley and Kingsbury grade schools

It was a good feeling to get the dictionaries out to the students by the second week of school. A series of questions were asked by Lion Tom after distributing the books. Such as what is a dictionary? What is Braille, Sign Language, Roman Numerals and the longest word? All that and more can be found in the dictionary.

Lion George talked about why Lions do Candy Day. The Spring donations from Candy Day are donated to the Salvation Army for the food bank, and the Fall Candy Day donation is divided between the three schools Door Village Lions watch over, to help with school supplies instead of teachers pitching in their money for things.

Lion Karen covered the program KidsSight which screens children as young as 6 months to school age to check their eyes. She mentioned about Lion boxes with the emblem on the box that can be found in front of Krogers, on street corners, and doctor offices to collect old glasses. Lion Karen proceeded to talk about the use of old glasses that can be refurbished and used in Mexico and South America. Door Village had three members that made the trip to Mexico this past year, staying up to two weeks to help fit the glasses.

Lion Irene talked briefly about all the other programs Lions work on, such as: Parks, School for the Blind, Speech and Hearing, Cancer Control, Leader Dog, Eye Bank, Care and Helping Hands, Diabetes Awareness, and the Salvation Army.

She invited all to consider becoming a Leo while in high school. She mentioned upcoming events such as the Sunflower Fair and the Door Village Festival where the food wagon will be selling hot dog, hamburger and delicious fries. All the projects are funded through the profits made from the food wagon.

We hope the students take the time to talk to us when they see us at the festival, just to tell us what they learned from their dictionaries.


