NOTICE FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Effective at the beginning of this year, the Global Leadership Team (GLT) and the Global Membership Team (GMT) have been combined with the new Global Service Team (GST) to form the Global Action Team (GAT).

On July 22, 2017, the Council of Governors appointed PCC Dave Eisen to serve as the MD25 GLT Chair and PDG Glen Georges to serve as the MD25 GMT Chair. By virtue of being Council Chair, I assumed the position of the MD25 GAT Chair.

With only a limited amount of information regarding the duties/responsibilities of the GST available prior to the July Council of Governors Meeting, the Governors decided to leave this position vacant until such time as the duties/responsibilities of the GST could be posted for review by interested candidates.

Since then, Lions Clubs International has published a set of guidelines for the MD Global Service Team (GST) Chair, and these guidelines have been posted on the MD25 website at www.indianalions.org. They also may be accessed by clicking the following link: http://e-district.org/userfiles/602/file/GST-MD-Coordinator.pdf.

Lions Clubs International recommends that the MD GST Chair have experience in Leading and developing service activities; famili<mark>arity with LCI an</mark>d LCIF service programs; being a graduate or facu<mark>lty mem</mark>ber of an Advanced Lions Leadership Institute or Faculty Development Institute; and proficiency in using technology (i.e. MyLCI, email, social media, etc.).

This notice shall serve as an invitation for interested candidates to submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) for consideration for this 3-year position. The LOI shall include the candidate's qualifications and express a desire to fulfill the obligations of this position.

All Letters of Intent must be received by Council Chair Ross Drapalik by 5:00 pm EDT on Friday, September 15, 2017. The LOI may be sent via email to ross, drapalik@sbcglobal.net or via U.S. mail to P.O. Box 1062, Martinsville, Indiana 46151.

The Council of Governors will be interviewing each candidate and making their final appointment at their meeting on October 21, 2017, in Suite 7 of the Indiana Lions State Office Building. The time of the meeting to be announced.

Hello Fellow Screeners,

I hope all is well with everyone. We are gearing up for another great year screening the children from 6 months to 6 years of age. (Head Start, and open screenings).



I know that it has been some time since I have had a chance to either meet with you or talk about this excellent program thru the Vision First Indiana Lions Eye Bank. With your efforts and hard work we met our goal last year of 20,000 + children in Indiana, and District A screened just over 3000. So I thank all of you, and all your helpers, For a job well done.

As all of you know we are JUST SCREENERS. So any information collected while screening either at a Head Start or open screening is **strictly confidential**.

I know it is hard to do at an open screening, where the parent or guardian would like to know the results. Please just tell them that we are JUST SCREENERS, and the information Will be sent to Operation KidSight, where it will be looked at by Ophthalmologist and if there are any issues, Lion Sheila Christoff will either contact the school nurse or the parent or guardian.

Also:

- 1. The only cameras to be used are Plus Optix.
- 2. All the child's information must be completed: Signed by the parent or guardian.
- 3. The paperwork for the screening needs to be filled out, where screening was held, and who was doing the screenings. And where the information needs to be sent back to.
- 4. Please send all this in AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, by waiting only delays the results.
- 5. Do not show the picture or result of what is shown on the monitor to the child or the parent or guardian.
- 6. If the child passes, you DO NOT need to print a label. If they fail please do 3 shots and print each (3) label and put them on the child's paperwork. Front or back. If they pass just write pass where label would go.

I MUST SAY AGAIN WE ARE ONLY SCREENERS, NOT EYE DOCTORS.

If I hear of anyone, whether the Lion in charge of the screening or a helper, giving the results out to the parent or guardian, I WILL tell you that you will not be asked to screen again.

We are going to buy another camera for the District, it will be an S12 (hand held). This is being provided by the Eye Glass Recycling and Vision Services Committee. So If you see one of the members, give them a big THANK YOU.
