

My answer is, do what best suits your club while following the recommendations from the medical experts and the State. When I held the first cabinet meeting, it was outside, I had hand sanitizer and had everyones temperature taken so to help to put people at ease, we were wearing masks, and socially distanced. I had tables spread all around my back yard, had hand sanitizer, and allowed the individuals to decide where they wanted to sit, and how THEY would feel the most comfortable.

Our District ended Lions Year 2019-2020 with positive membership growth with 1,739 Lions in Hartford and Litchfield Counties!

Lions Year 2020-2021 provides us with new opportunities to expand our membership even more. As you may have heard, Lions Clubs International instituted the North America Membership Initiative (NAMI) and DG Heidi opted into this initiative early. Four teams were built and plans were laid to begin implementing on the July 1st start of the new Lions Year.

1VDG Ed Fenton and Zone Chair Raj Shrestha are leading efforts to investigate ideas to start new clubs within our District. They are already working on one new club! If you have any ideas for new clubs, please reach out to either 1VDG Ed at edehlions@aol.com or Zone Chair Raj at

rajshrestha2003@yahoo.com. Remember, there are no fees to charter a new club between now and December 31, 2020. So let's add one or two new clubs to our existing Pride of 53 clubs in District 23-B.

I am leading the effort to recruiting new members for our existing Lions Clubs. One of the initiatives that DG Heidi Zacchera has instituted is to provide a resource (called a "buddy") to clubs with less than 20 members. I plan to personally visit all seventeen clubs with less than twenty members over the next 90 days and bring the DG-designated buddy with me to experience a club meeting and then to help support the club this Lions Year to recruit new members. I am pleased to report that one club (Hartland) already has more than twenty members! To support your membership recruitment efforts, we may meet with your local First Selectman/Mayor or our town/city officials. We may suggest meeting with your local Chamber of Commerce. A buddy could help you plan and carry out a membership

recruitment event. All buddies have been notified by DG Heidi and we hope to help our clubs add more Lions to lighten your club's service load throughout the District. And remember, there is no entrance fee if a new Lion joins before December 31, 2020. So let's all keep our eyes out for quality recruits just waiting to be asked to join Lions.

To round out our District's NAMI Team, PCC Kathy Randall is promoting leadership opportunities with GLT Jim Trompeter and PDG Dave Yadach is promoting inspiring service opportunities. Other resources available are Lion Akella Sharma, who is chairing our New Voices Initiative, and Immediate Past GMT Frank Longo, who is supporting club retention efforts. The District has many resources for our fifty-three clubs to be successful. Please don't hesitate to reach out to any of these resources to grow your club's membership.

The Windsor Locks Lions held their second "Drive Thru Food Drive" on August 15th. Residents were asked to bring non-perishable food items to the Town Hall parking lot, where Locks Lions were present to unload donations from their vehicles. Other Lion members and Leos then sorted, and date checked the donations before helping to stock the shelves at the Community

Pantry. The Drive ran from 9 am until noon and was advertised via Facebook, newspaper articles, and postings on the Lions and Town Signs.

It was estimated that over \$3,000 in food items were donated during the drive. In addition, residents donated over \$1,300 in cash, checks, and gift certificates. The monetary

donations will be used by the Pantry to replenish needed food items as they become depleted. The Community Pantry serves between 90 and 100 families on a weekly basis.

Planning is now underway for the Club's Thanksgiving Food Drive that is scheduled for November 21st.

Pierogies and the Food Pantry

With the Taste of Harwinton Food Truck Festival cancelled in May, the Harwinton Lions needed to find creative ways to raise funds for all the community causes we support. Lion Donna Perrault had an idea: since our club is locally known for the delicious pierogies we serve at the Harwinton Fair, why not sell Holy Pierogies, so folks could make their own fair food? And why not ask customers to bring food donations for the Harwinton Food Pantry when they picked up their potato dumplings on July 18 and 19?

So, Roland Perreault set up a website where customers could buy Holy Pierogies—which are made by a local Connecticut company—online. We promoted the sale through social media, and Harwinton Lions members directly sold the frozen pierogies to friends and family. Some generous members donated extra packages for same-day sales. A great Lions

crew came together in the Harwinton Post Office parking lot on pick-up weekend, a tent shading us in the mid-summer heat, and a generator powering a freezer that kept the packages frozen. We sold out of all 252 packages of pierogies midway through our second day of distribution. But sales were not our

only mission: sharing food with people who need help was an important part of our effort. And the response for Food Pantry donations was enormous: Robin Reid and her husband, Jay, packed up two pickup truckloads of food over the weekend.
