I am delighted to share the wonderful news that many impactful service activities have been launched by our clubs across District 23B and making a meaningful difference in our communities. Our new club leaders have demonstrated incredible dedication and energy, upholding the legacy of service, leadership, and membership growth that defines us as Lions.

Several clubs have proudly welcomed new members, bringing fresh enthusiasm to our efforts to serve alongside our leaders. As we look ahead, let's continue building on this momentum by focusing on recruiting even more members. Expanding our membership will empower us to reach unserved and underserved communities, amplifying the impact of our mission.

In the first half of the Lions year, we have made tremendous efforts to strengthen our clubs and our District. However, there is room for improvement, particularly in Club Service Reporting, which currently stands at only 40%. Let's encourage more clubs to report on their service activities and highlight the incredible work they are accomplishing.

Our clubs have added 83 new members, but with 59 members dropped, the net growth is 24—down slightly from 27 in the first quarter. While this reflects positive progress toward our District goals, we need to put in a little more effort to achieve them fully. Great progress so far—let's keep the momentum going!

By the end of November, the first round of Zone meetings was successfully concluded. The Zone Chairs appreciated hearing from all clubs and are now planning their next steps to assist clubs in need.

You may have already heard from your Zone Chairs and Past District Governors about our District's exciting new initiative—**Students' Voices Public Speaking Contest**. We plan to make this an annual tradition. I encourage all clubs to prepare for the contest and ensure their winners advance to the Zone-level competition. 

Guidelines for Decorating your Tree



- Price per Tree is \$150.00. The Lions will stake and display your tree, provide signage, listing the participant and Charity as well as electricity.
- 2. Edible items are prohibited, no candy, popcorn, etc.
- 3. Please secure all decorations and lights to your tree using pipe cleaners, small zip ties or other string/ties/wire.
- No offensive or inappropriate décor. We reserve the right to remove offensive displays.
- Ornaments must be waterproof, shatterproof, no paper or GLASS.
- 6. No Tree Skirts or other items for the bottom of the tree.
- 7. LED Outdoor lights only, we reserve the right to remove any lights that are not LED.
- You need to provide an outdoor rated extension cord. Lengths will vary but plan on at least 25' in length. In addition, please provide an outdoor extension cord safety cover.

Decoration/Tree Removal

The Fairgrounds will be open from 8:00AM Monday 12/16 till 4:00PM for ALL Tree removal, if you wish to remove only your decorations please let the Lions know and they will dispose of your tree.

Please remember the tree is yours and you are free to remove it and display it at your business or home, or donate your tree.
