District Governor's Corner

It's wonderful to see Lions and Leo Clubs working side by side and reporting on their service to showcase the impact we make on the lives of those in need. I encourage you to continue volunteering, recruiting and engaging new members, raising funds for service projects, and most importantly enjoying the process. The District is here to support you in your service initiatives. Together, we will "Make our Mark!" This is the International President's theme. Please do not forget to include diversity in membership recruitment, such as members from different cultures, different professions, different life stages, different hobbies, different causes. I believe that "Diversity Strengthens Service" and that's my theme this year. Let me share some highlights of this great service:

VETERANS STAND DOWN:

Veterans Stand Down took place on September 20 at six different locations throughout the State of Connecticut this year. Under the leadership of District 23-B Stand Down Chair Eric Crosset of Windsor Lions Club, District 23-B Clubs served at the State Veteran's Home in Rocky Hill and Bristol. This event took place between 9 am and 2 pm. We are pleased to report that hundreds of veterans registered and were served at Rocky Hill and Bristol during the Veterans Stand Down.



SECOND DISTRICT CABINET MEETING:

Our second District Cabinet Meeting of this Lions Year was held on October 7 at the Berlin Lions Agricultural Museum - Berlin Lions Fairgrounds. District Lions leaders and Lions clubs were recognized with District Excellence Awards and Club Excellence Awards for the 2022-2023 Lions year, presented by 2022-2023 DG IPCC Dave Roberts. Leo Mihika Joshee was honored at the Cabinet meeting for her appointment to the Leo Advisory Panel for Lions International. Congratulation to Leo Mihika and District 23-B for this recognition by Lions International. Zone Chairs also received their Zone Chair training certificates.





ZONE MEETINGS:

All seven Zone meetings successfully concluded as planned in October. At each Zone meeting, a new initiative—the Student Voices Public Speaking Contest—was introduced to club officers. Contest guidelines were presented by IPCC Dave Roberts at the Zone 1

and 2 meetings, PCC Ev Lyons at the Zone 3 and 4 meetings, and PDG Ed Fenton at the Zone 5, 6, and 7 meetings. All Zone Chairs are doing excellent work supporting clubs in their respective zones to enhance service to the community.

BREAKTHROUGH T1D DIABETES:

<u>Connecticut Lions</u> Diabetes Awareness Committee supported <u>Breakthrough T1D</u> <u>Greater CT Western MA</u> on their <u>Six Flags New England</u> Walk. I volunteered at this event with MD-23 Diabetes Chair IPCC Dave Roberts, District 23-B Diabetes Chair Raine Pedersen, FVDG Peter Cianciolo, and members of Riverton Lions Club.

DISTRICT 23-B DONATION TO A LOCAL NON-PROFIT:

It was a pleasure to support and collaborate with a local non-profit organization. The West Hartford Lumbini Lions Club and Hartford County Everest Centennial Lions Club of District 23-B donated 60 chairs and 6 party tables to the Nepalese Association of Connecticut (NAConn) for use by community members on special occasions. I had the pleasure of presenting a \$1,000.00 check to NAConn for their Kids' Summer School program as part of the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) District and Clubs Community Impact Grant.



HURRICANE HELENE DISASTER RELIEF PROJECT:

District 23-B coordinated a Disaster Relief Supplies Collection Project to support Hurricane Helene relief efforts in the Asheville area of North Carolina. Supplies were collected from October 14 to October 25, with Past District Governor Steve Daigle Coordinating the project. In collaboration with the Massachusetts Lions, we filled four 53-foot long trucks with supplies ready for transport.

We are excited to announce that **\$5,044.74** has been allocated from LCIF for this year's District Community Grant (DCG), and DG Raj Shrestha has decided to make these funds

available to individual clubs, allowing you the opportunity to apply for support in bringing your service projects to life.

Eligibility and Application Process:

Please note that clubs that have applied for DCG funding in the past two consecutive years are ineligible this year. For those eligible, here are the next steps:

- Application Submission: Clubs must submit a qualifying application to the District GST by November 15th. Please click <u>HERE</u> for the application .
- Review and Selection: Our committee will review applications and notify clubs of award status by December 5th.
- 3. **Final Application Completion**: Awarded clubs will need to complete the final grant application by **December 20th** for cabinet approval in January.

This is a wonderful opportunity to enhance our community service impact, and we encourage all eligible clubs to apply. Please reach out if you have any questions or need further information.



- Price per Tree is \$150.00. The Lions will stake and display your tree, provide signage, listing the participant and Charity as well as electricity.
- 2. Edible items are prohibited, no candy, popcorn, etc.
- 3. Please secure all decorations and lights to your tree using pipe cleaners, small zip ties or other string/ties/wire.
- No offensive or inappropriate décor. We reserve the right to remove offensive displays.
- Ornaments must be waterproof, shatterproof, no paper or GLASS.
- 6. No Tree Skirts or other items for the bottom of the tree.
- 7. LED Outdoor lights only, we reserve the right to remove any lights that are not LED.
- You need to provide an outdoor rated extension cord. Lengths will vary but plan on at least 25' in length. In addition, please provide an outdoor extension cord safety cover.

Decoration/Tree Removal

The Fairgrounds will be open from 8:00AM Monday 12/16 till 4:00PM for ALL Tree removal, if you wish to remove only your decorations please let the Lions know and they will dispose of your tree.

Please remember the tree is yours and you are free to remove it and display it at your business or home, or donate your tree.
