DISTRICT AWARDS BREAKFASTS: We are moving forward with the annual awards' breakfasts in May! This is your opportunity to recognize two members of your club, one with a Lion of the Year award and another with the Rose Amanda Freeman Selfless Service Award.

Also, due to spacing, we will not be able to accommodate walk-ins the day of the events. Please sign-up as soon as possible after you receive the registration flyer.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S SERVICE CHALLENGE: Please remember that the application for the DG Service Challenge patch is due to GST Chair Phyllis Perry (phyllisdueseason@gmail.com) by the end of May. The flyer and report form are attached to this newsletter.

We had many clubs who stepped up to the three-week challenge of supporting the victims of the Kentucky disaster. Any club who donated goods or funds to the Kentucky project may use that event to substitute for any one of the four areas of the service challenge. If you want to use this as one of your projects, simply write "Kentucky" in the corresponding spot on the form and whether you donated goods or made a cash donation.

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION: I encourage all clubs and individual Lions to consider a donation to LCIF! As of today, we have 83% of the clubs in our district that have contributed to LCIF this year. Any donation, no matter the size, is appreciated and will go to good use.

Right now, LCIF is focused on the crisis in Ukraine and raising funds to support people in that area of the world. If you send a check to LCIF, please notate that it is for the Ukrainian crisis. You can also donate online through a specific link (Refugees and Displaced Persons Fund) and your donation will be directed to Ukraine.

The following excerpt is from Lions International:

The ongoing conflict in Ukraine is posing substantial challenges to the Ukrainian people. More than 1,000,000 people have already fled from their homes as they seek to escape the violence,

and it's estimated that up to 4,000,000 people may try to leave the country as the crisis continues.

Please consider a donation to the LCIF <u>Refugees and Displaced Persons Fund</u>. This will help ensure that Lions are there to help people find the safety and security they desperately need.

STATE CONVENTION: The State Convention will be a one-day event on Saturday May 14th. The convention will be held at the CT National Guard's Camp Nett in Niantic. You will soon be receiving your delegate forms and convention information from Cabinet Secretary Pat Daigle.

All Lions are welcome to participate in the convention. I encourage each club, at a minimum, to send your full complement of delegates to vote. It is very important that you are involved in selecting and supporting your future district leadership.

MEMBERSHIP (From GMA Champion IPDG Heidi Zacchera): In spite of another Covid year, but having the State opening up more this year, we are presently at +20! (We finished last year +11, and there were another 4 that had signed up within last year too).

Now all of you are probably saying, GREAT...we did our job...NO! We need to keep forging ahead and looking for more people that want to make their communities better! There is no entrance fee through this Lions year! Many hands make light work! New members bring in new ideas, new energy, new enthusiasm!

People are primed to want to do something now that they have been holed up for so long. Give them something to do by telling them about Lions! Have an informational meeting at a local breakfast/lunch restaurant and set up displays, have a video running of Lions at work, and talk Lions to whomever comes in! Select a small group from your club to help talk to potential members, or people who are looking to be educated about Lions. You don't want to have a large group of Lions there as that is intimidating to some people, so they won't feel comfortable approaching. You can ask your members for email addresses of people who could be interested, so you can invite them, but not badger them.

Another thing...I'm a broken record...you know what I'm going to say...Plan a service project! Clean up a park. Advertise well in advance saying you are going to be doing this, ask the community to help you!!! Give them a phone number to contact and the day and time of the event. It works! Bringing in ONE person can mushroom out to another nine people. (a friend, of a friend, etc. It worked for me!).

The weather is getting nicer, so people will want to be outside. You could even plan an outdoor gathering at someone's house. Have one during the day for those who are available, and then one in the evening for those who are busy during the day.

If you want any help, I'll be there!
