# District Governor's Corner DG Heidi Zacchera

District 23 B clubs are doing a fantastic job this year keeping their members engaged, and holding fundraisers and service projects! If you want other ideas of other activities you can do, check out the Lions Roar and the LCI website. Thank you, Clubs, and club presidents!

Blood Drives are very easy to do during Covid! You can assist the Red Cross with a minimum of three people! We are even finding that two people can handle it, as long as they want to stay on their toes!

Clubs near Bloomfield have been asked to assist with a new vaccination location. The clinics run from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Volunteers help with questionnaires, registration and line assistance, paperwork assistance "runners".

Today we were on a call with the DPH, who is going to give us inroads to get involved in the vaccine effort.

So far, we have served 51,339 people, having 326 activities, 8,343 volunteer hours. Donated \$64,772, and raised \$85,668. (Not including clubs that didn't report)

Many clubs are holding their membership consistent, if not bringing in new members. District membership is at 1729 a minus 10 from last year, which is the lowest it has been. There is still time to bring in new members! Remember there is no entrance fee. Invite people of your community to help you with projects and help other organizations with their initiatives. We can still perform membership inductions virtually, which is the same process without the candles. I feel we need to induct the members in a timely fashion so that they feel a part of the club. AND the sooner you get them involved with something, the sooner they feel the ownership.

We've almost visited all the clubs! YAY!

Midwinter conference happened Feb 26-28, virtually! Many great class choices and International Director Patti Hill gave a very inspiring speech that is a must see. Awards were given.
