As you can see from the pictures, we were forced to evacuate on June 18th with 79 campers and staff. Fortunately it was our physically challenged school age session (strangely every time we have had to evacuate it has been this group! We have decided to move this group to the last week)! We told our older teens the truth and asked them not to tell the 'littles' which at camp was anyone 12 and under. We told them we had been invited to perform our talent show in Flagstaff at the high school. They did in fact perform in the gym. Things with the evacuation went incredibly smooth.

We decided that evacuations are really just road trips to see beautiful friends who welcome you with open arms and treat you like family. Thank you to our Flagstaff Sunrise Lions family for organizing our stay. We came to you because we knew you had the resources and the manpower to help. Thank you Tony & Jeannine for housing us at Flagstaff High School!!! You were awesome! Thanks too for our friends at Mike & Rhonda's for sending breakfast for 79 with our Flagstaff Sunrise Lions! Thank you to Fire Creek Coffee Company for COFFEE! Thank you to NAU for putting us up through the weekend, to Taco Bell for feeding us, and to the Drury for housing our year round staff and our puppies.

Thank you to our families who share their beautiful children with us. Thank you for trusting us to keep them safe. Thanks to our campers who teach us about humanity, compassion, joy and faith. Thanks to our staff for rising to our expectations and loving our campers so much. You amaze me every day. I am so proud of you all.

Thanks to our Lions for having the guts to make Tatiyee a reality and to all of our DONORS and PARTNERS who continue to make this happen every year!

We had to cancel one week this season until the fire was controlled, but we put as many of our new campers into the other sessions as possible.

Pre-evacuation orders were lifted 10 days after we evacuated. We were able to serve anyone without respiratory and or seizure issues (because of smoke and heat issues) last week.

We are now totally back to normal and we will be seeing a group of 60 Multi-challenged School age kids on Sunday and have 3 weeks left this summer. Every session is completely full. Lastly, thank you to all of our firefighters who saved our community and our camp. We are truly grateful for all of you.




# Student from Mexico with Multiple Sclerosis Receives Wheelchair from Lions Foundation of Arizona
