ENERGIZER BUNNY COLUMN!

Good morning from the District Energizer Bunny:

It is so good to be writing to the good Lions of 21 B once again. By the time you read this, you will have had, what I know will have been, another successful Fall Kickoff. No doubt Lion Fred & company did their usual awesome job in see that all went well for everyone I attendance.

Like A & C, 21 B has seen a changing of the guard at the top with Lion Jim being District Governor. To you Lion Barbara, thanks for being a strong leader; & for your dedication & hard work in shaping 21 B, & making it, the special district it will continue to be. I'm glad that I got in on some of that, before moving back to lowa. Having said that, there are some things that will remain the same. Lion Barbara will continue to be, Editor of "The Buzz." It's very informative; & it's a wonderful way to keep up on happenings in the district. The other thing, (& this is what excites me,) is that I will continue to work with Lion Barbara, & remain, your Energizer Bunny; & write inspirational messages as the spirit moves me to do that.

In this regard, (While I've communicated with a few in email in the District,) I want to let you know that I'm doing great; after major surgery in Rochester, Minnesota at Methodist Hospital. The week of July 7-14, saw my brother & I make four round trips to Mayo Clinic in Rochester; for further tests. Since May 3, the cancer center in Mason City, lowa put me through a series of tests; but they were all inconclusive;

& there was nothing definitive that came out of them. So, my Specialist initiated conversation with Mayo, & things began happening big time. The surgery took place on July 18. A portion of liver was removed which had cancer. Some Lymph Nodes were removed that were discovered, & just for good measure, as long as they were in the neighborhood, they took my gall bladder; as that had stones.

Through it all, I came out well. & even from my sick bed, I remained the Energizer Bunny you would have been proud of. Doctors & nurses alike, could not believe my positivity & how upbeat I was, after such an ordeal. I can't imagine the volumes of patients they see on a daily basis. But as one doctor put it, he'd never seen anyone quite like me. I guess I was a real inspiration to the surgical team who performed this major surgery. I returned to lowa the afternoon of July 22. Amazing as this may seem, I didn't have to stay in a skilled bed at the hospital. Doctors thought that I was doing so well I could handle being at the apartment. My incision is healing very nicely. I won't have to have stitches taken out; everything was glued.

In way of upcoming appointments, I see my primary doctor on Monday afternoon. We go back to Rochester for follow-ups, August 23-24 respectively. Cat-scan on August 23; blood work & visit with Cancer Doctor the following day. I'm sure that whether or not I go through Chemo Therapy will be discussed at that time.

So there you go. I wanted to use this message to give you an update on my status. All is well! I'm happy to report. Perhaps Lion Barbara mentioned something about me at the Fall Kickoff; but now you've heard it from me. You can't keep a good Lion down; or to put it another way, (You can't keep the Energizer Bunny down!) Until next time, I remain.
