## CLUBS ARE NOT AUTONOMOUS - I

spoke about this at the Kickoff – The saying "oh the clubs are autonomous" .... We need to stop saying this as it is not true. Autonomous in the way each club operates **BUT** not in the way each club reports to international. Each club is a part of the largest service organization in the world. As such, each club has obligations to pay dues, file monthly membership and activity reports, and to provide service to the community. Clubs also are required to protect the Lions logo and name. We Lions wear a lapel pin over our heart – not because we pay dues but because we are proud of what we are a part of – LCI and what it stands for – service. A district governor takes an oath to protect the Lions logo and the Lions name – that means that a governor is responsible to make sure that all areas of the district is being served. So how can we operate autonomously when we have awesome responsibilities as clubs and members – we can't and that's why we say "WE" serve! I have responsibilities to our organization and so do you as club officers and club members. You can check this



out for yourself on the LCI website, Board Policy Manual, Chapter V Clubs.

Let's just say there is a BIG difference between a "community" club and a "Lions" club. A community club could do as they please and not report to anyone. But since we all have the word "Lions" in our club name, we have an obligation to the organization to do membership and activity reports so they in turn can report what we as clubs do around the world.

**ATTENTION CLUB PRESIDENTS** – If you attended the 21-B Kickoff, you are entitled to get your registration fee reimbursed by the district (early fee only – if you paid a late fee, we will reimburse you only the early fee amount). I am offering this for all cabinet meetings this year. Please contact Cabinet Treasurer, Adrienne Ponce, for reimbursement. Email: [ponce7670@gmail.com](mailto:ponce7670@gmail.com) In an effort to reduce meetings for club officers, we are integrating all zone meetings in conjunction with each cabinet meeting this year. We hope this reduces the amount of travel and meetings for you.

**THE "M" WORD!** - Another thing I spoke about at Kickoff – The "M" word!



I believe we do not have a membership problem – I believe we have a service and leadership problem. If we provide more service and leadership then the membership will come.

With this – I have banned the word "membership" this year – if we continuously beat everyone up about "we need more members – we have a membership problem" – well we aren't fixing the problem. So let's try something a bit different and let's focus on service and leadership this year and see how it goes! See page five for more on this.



## MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP REPORT (MMR) – ATTENTION CLUB

**SECRETARIES** - Request that all club secretaries go online on the first day of each month and file a no change membership report. That way you are done – you make any necessary changes as they arise during the month. Then if you are called out of town or you get sick or what usually happens at the end of the month – the LCI system is overloaded or doing maintenance and the system is down – you are done and you have the report filed. This is a change from the LCI procedure – remember LCI procedures are “guidelines” as LCI makes procedures for worldwide use. It is the governor’s prerogative to implement district procedures and processes. Please adhere to this so we are not spending an inordinate amount of follow-up on the reporting of required information. Yes, we are ALL volunteers but we are volunteers with responsibilities. Remember – Lions create real change – we need to let the world know what we do!

## Now for something different.... INFORMATION to share with all LIONS!



Let’s chat about the differences of what we call the meetings we attend at the district and multiple district level. First let’s define a district and a multiple district. A district is made up of at least 35 clubs and 1250 members. We have three districts in Arizona – 21A, 21B, and 21C.

A multiple district is made up of two or more sub-districts. Our multiple district is MD21. At the district level we meet four times a year in what are called cabinet meetings. Two of those four cabinet meetings are held within multiple district meetings – one called the MD21 Mid-Year Leadership Conference and the other the MD21 Convention. The first cabinet meeting is also referred to as the Kickoff and the third cabinet meeting is held with the district convention.

So at the district level we have the first cabinet meeting (also called the Kickoff), the second cabinet meeting held with the MD21 Mid-Year Leadership Conference,

the third cabinet meeting held in the district with the district convention, and then the fourth cabinet meeting held with the MD21 Convention. A convention means we vote for officers and board members for projects. Otherwise it is a conference as no voting takes place. Let’s start calling these meetings with the right nomenclature – a cabinet meeting or kickoff, a conference, or a convention (where we vote).

It costs \$64 for each club member. The club then adds administrative monies on top of this cost to run the club.

BILLINGS ARE DONE IN JULY AND JANUARY (from June and December membership numbers, so club secretaries need to drop members by June 30<sup>th</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup> so you are not charged for the member)

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP: LCI ½ DUES (\$21.50) FOR 2<sup>ND</sup>, 3<sup>RD</sup>, AND 4<sup>TH</sup> FAMILY MEMBER living in the same household.

LCI will suspend a club who is overdue 90 days.

## MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORTS (MAR) – ALL CLUB PRESIDENTS AND SECRETARIES – 2VDG Bob Hutton



Our Lions motto "We Serve", each day members of Lions serve our community in small and large projects and just go about our way upon completing a project. We ourselves are our worst advocate not sharing our accomplishments as Lions. For example, in district 21-B we have 43 clubs but only 22 clubs have reported July activities. For August, 21 clubs have reported activities – why? Aren’t we Lions each and every day of the year – do we take our Lions pin off in the summer and not do anything for others? Is it that old time saying of “well I don’t do

service for recognition – but guess what – you are a part of a SERVICE organization that thrives on being able to promote what we do worldwide – it goes back to being OBLIGATED as members of a club to report everything that we do.

LCI suggests as soon as a project is completed, the club secretary goes online and submits the activity. As club presidents, you are the CEO and ultimately responsible to ensure that reports are submitted on time. Do you know if your secretary cannot submit the report on time – you should go online and do the report – all club presidents have access and as a club president should follow-up to make sure your secretary and treasurer is doing the job they were elected to do. Don't know how to access MyLci?? Contact a GMT member to help you through the process.



An activity can be done by just one Lion. We all do things without thinking we are doing them as a Lion – you are a Lion 24/7 so if your neighbor needs assistance like going to a doctor's appointment, report that as service. We do a good job reporting when many Lions and money is expended on projects. As secretary, please remind your club members to submit every activity they do.

Remember LCI has created 100 million of acts of service for the centennial in four service areas - Youth, Vision, Hunger, and Environment. Clubs can earn banner patches supporting these service areas. We need to focus on reporting all activities – international can partner with many more organizations like Special Olympics because we can promote just how much we do worldwide.

## Lions Leadership Training and Development

Did you know that your dues to LCI pay for programs that come out of LCI for YOU? There are so many valuable programs to assist the club and the members. If you haven't done so – go online and take a look at what they have to offer to you. Let's all become experts to grow our organization.



## SERVICE LEADERSHIP ASSISTANCE

Two months completed for the 2015-2016 Lion year and clubs are gearing up for new (and old) service options and projects. So many of our district clubs slow down activities during the hot months but it's definitely time to recharge the energy and engage our enthusiasm for service!

Help is available for those club officers who were unable to attend officer training in May or the 21-B Kick-off and/or, perhaps, received little to no pass down from last year's officers. Don't struggle - if your club's officers need help, contact your zone chair or me.

21-B is fortunate to have many veteran leaders who are current SME's – Subject Matter Experts. Help is only a phone call or email away – JUST ASK.

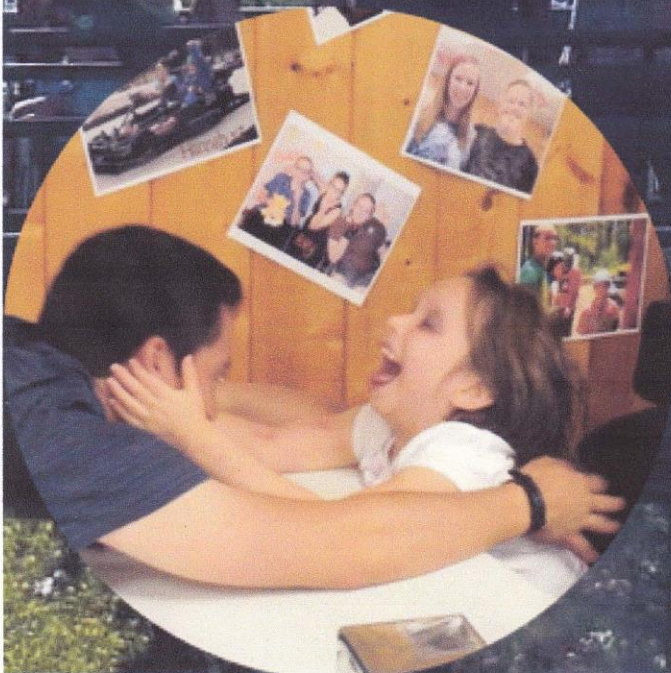

## ATTENTION CLUB TREASURERS!!!!!!!

I wanted to share what LCI shares with me so we are both knowledgeable as to the process.

Accounts Receivable & Club Account Services Department  
DG Check list for Club Account Status Review

- DG RECAPS are emailed to you at the beginning of each month, reflecting club aging.
- Encourage club officers to register online. Treasurers can pay online if the club approves.
- Clubs can pay online by visiting [www.lionsclubs.org](http://www.lionsclubs.org). Click the “submit reports” link, after logging in, click CLUB, STATEMENT followed by PAY NOW. You may pay by Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express credit. Debit cards are accepted.
- Club balances should be paid according to the terms established by the association; however, to avoid suspension, balances should be paid no later than 90 days after billing.
- Club balances outstanding beyond 120 days can cause clubs to be placed on suspension if balances are equal to or exceeding US\$20/member or \$1,000, whichever is less over 120 days.
- Anticipated high risk of suspension in November and May can be avoided with prompt club payments.
- High cancellation rates can be avoided in December and June if payments are received prior to the 29th of the month following suspension.
- Clubs can be reactivated within 12 months following cancellation, if eligible. Full payment along with a Reactivation Report is required, signed by you.
- Club Treasurers can view statements online and avoid mailing delays. Please encourage club treasurers to check the opt-out option on the association’s website to discontinue receiving mailed club statements.
- Clubs in Good Standing are eligible to participate in local elections. The current dues billing must be paid leaving no International dues and fees greater than US\$10.00 unpaid and balances over 90 days must not exceed US\$50.00.
- Beginning **July 1, 2015**, clubs will automatically be placed on Financial Suspension if balances beyond **90 days** are equal to or exceeding US\$20/member or \$1,000 or greater, and cancellation will occur after the 28th of the month following suspension if full payment is not received. As a result, anticipated high suspension will be reported in October and April. Also, clubs canceled more than twice will be ineligible for reactivation.
