



Bill Risen of Parker Lions Club Elected for Sheriff of La Paz County



Bill Risen began his Law Enforcement career in 1972 when he was discharged from the Army. Bill went to work for the Monterey Park Police Department. During his time with the Monterey Park Police Department he worked his way up through the ranks. He worked in the Traffic Bureau, Detective Bureau, Patrol Bureau, Canine Bureau, Narcotic Bureau and the Gang Unit. When he retired after 30 years with the MPPD he was assigned as a Lieutenant in the Investigations Bureau and he had about 15 investigators working for him including the Crime Impact Team the Asian Gang Unit and Narcotics Unit. He also had personnel that he was responsible for that were assigned to the U.S. Customs and the Los Angeles Impact Team which was dedicated to the eradication of Clandestine drug units.

While with the Monterey Park P.D. Bill was introduced to Lions and became a member of the Monterey Park Lions Club. The Lions Club was responsible for White Canes as well as Lions Manner, a large multi story affordable housing unit. Bill was President of the Monterey Park Lions for two years, 1st Vice President, 2nd VP, 3rd VP etc.

He then moved to Parker Arizona where he became a volunteer for the Parker Police Department and was ultimately hired while working records, and evidence and providing a department manual. Bill worked for them for about 5 years. Bill also became actively involved with the Parker Lions having been President for the Past 12 Years. He also became an advocate for veterans as well as the elderly.

Bill then went to work full time for the Colorado River Regional Crisis Shelter for Domestic Violence. He worked there for eight years helping victims of domestic violence as well as becoming the only certified instructor for court order domestic violence suspects. During this period he noted a lack of responsiveness to DV Victims by the courts as well as law enforcement. Bill was instrumental in bringing the Domestic Violence Fatality Review Board to the County and he assisted in the formation of the La Paz County Regional Veterans Court.

Arizona School Boards Association & Arizona School Administrators 59th Annual Conference

95 new member candidates were identified statewide on December 14 & 15 at the Arizona School Boards Association & Arizona School Administrators 59th annual conference held at the Arizona Biltmore, the Lions of Arizona were represented for the first time with several members from around the state participating. Lions of Arizona were one of 120 participants in the "Partner Pavilion," which is like a trade show. Booths were lined up in rows and the attendees visited as many as they wanted to. Additionally, there was a \$600 drawing for those that visited every booth and had their entry marked, which drove a lot of folks by the Lions booth. Prominently located near one of the bars didn't hurt, either.

Lions conversed with school board members, teachers, superintendents, and other school administrators from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm on Wednesday afternoon, and all day on Thursday between 7:30 am and 7:00 pm. Believe it or not, the most asked question was "What is Lions?" With a smile, visitors became well informed on what Lions are all about.

A few folks stopped by just to say "Thanks," be it for helping them get glasses when they were children, helping family or friends with surgeries, or for assisting in their school districts with vision screenings and glasses for their students that needed assistance. Most were intrigued with the SPOT machine, and how quickly it worked. A few were very intrigued, and came back to ask additional questions several times. A couple of Lions that serve on their local school boards also stopped by – David Lara from San Luis and Mike Weaver from Gold Canyon.

Since this was a definite success, we all should see some great new members and many more schools wanting Lions to visit and perform vision screenings, Flags For First Graders, Leos, and other services. This would not have been successful without Lions volunteering. A huge roar of appreciation for Gerry Oglesbee from Goodyear for helping Wednesday evening, and to Dave & Ann Roberts from Wickenburg, Gary & Cheryl Seat from Casa Grande, Jim Sterenberg from Mesa Thunderbird, Mike Weaver, Richard Hopkins from Buckeye, and everyone else that lent a hand all day Thursday. Each year the organization may recognize two individuals who exemplify its standards of service.

Two members of the Tucson Downtown Lions Club are also officers of the DAR Tucson Chapter. Lion Bev Giordano is the Regent of the Tucson Chapter and Lion Jean Yokley is 1st Vice-Regent. Because of their knowledge of the extensive community service of Lion Su-Lin Trepanitis and Lion Karen Greene, Lion Bev and Lion Jean nominated Lion Su-Lin for the DAR's Community Service Award for 2016 and Lion Karen for the DAR's Community Outreach Award For Literacy. Below are the award acknowledgements presented to Lion Su-Lin and Lion Karen at the Tucson Downtown Lions meeting on 3 November 2016.

The Community Outreach Award for Literacy presented to Lion Karen Greene: The Tucson Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution presented Karen Greene with the Community Outreach for Literacy Award. Karen is a Pima County Librarian and developed the 'BookBike', Books on Wheels and the free Reading Glasses Programs. This award recognizes Karen for her outstanding work in developing an innovative approach to reading.

The Community Service Award 2016 presented to Lion Su-Lin Trepanitis - The Tucson Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution presented the National Community Service Award to Su-Lin Trepanitis for her outstanding work with the Lion's Multi-Club Vision Screening Program in area schools. The Health Assistant at La Paloma Charter School was confronted with a child who needed glasses but could not afford them. Not knowing where to turn, she contacted LCI in Chicago, who in turn sent an email to DG Jim Whelan to see what could be done. DG Jim referred the item to his club's vision screening team and a quick phone call to the school revealed that none of the children had been screened for vision. A date was quickly established and 781 children were screened, including the young lady, who was a referral. An appointment was arranged for the little girl at the local America's Best and in a week she had two pairs of new glasses. Checking further we discovered that their other two campuses also need screening, and we will do them in late January. WE SERVE

CASA GRANDE LIONS WELCOMES ALL

New members or those that want to help the group with its volunteer programs are welcome at all meetings with no pressure to join the organization.

The Casa Grande Lions Club continues to provide services to the area in the form of vision screening, the collection of used glasses, hearing aids and cell phones to recycle, as well as books for the elementary school district. We also assist with the eye glasses for those who meet the criteria. Thanks to the Casa Grande community, our coffee, hot chocolate and snack sales at The Electric Light Parade were awesome! We have been using those funds to help pay for glasses and the recipients are so grateful. Grants and fundraisers help support the group's effort.

Since August 12, 2016, we have provided free vision screening for 15 schools, grades Kindergarten through 12th grade for 2,964 children in Eloy, Arizona City, Coolidge, as well as at the free clinic in Stanfield on the 1st Wednesday of each month. In February, we are scheduled to provide vision screening for 3 more schools, 1,474 children in Coolidge, Stanfield, Eloy. During the screenings we have identified students in middle school and older that were in need of glasses but not aware of the possibility of assistance with obtaining them. The lack of clear vision affects their school performances significantly.

The Casa Grande Lions welcomes volunteers, as well as new members. Visit us at the American Legion Post #8 at 713 N. Park Ave, Casa Grande. Our meetings are held on the first and third Thursdays of each month. We welcome your help as volunteers without any pressure to join the club as a formal member. 


Dear Leo Leaders in 21C.
