

State of Arizona Vision Screening Bill

Arizona is one of only four states that does not require vision screening of our school students. Yet, hearing exams are required. In 2016, a bill was introduced in the state legislature to require vision screenings of students as well. It would have allowed non-profits, such as Lions Clubs to do the screening at absolutely no cost to the students or schools. Unfortunately, after the bill passed out of the house of representatives, it was held in the senate because the senate president disagreed with it and the bill died. It was resurrected near the end of the session by our friends in the house, but senate opposition killed that one, too. On January 20, Lion Richard Hopkins from the Buckeye Lions testified at the house and was able to convince them to amend the original bill so that it allowed Lions to use the SPOT machines, and not use just an eye chart.

He has received commitment from several in the legislature to try and enact a similar bill in 2017. He is currently working on a draft bill that once it is presentable, he will forward it onto them for input. The bill will be finalized by the house staffers once the election is over in November. If Richard is successful in being elected to the Arizona House of Representatives, he will be given the honor of introducing the bill himself. Right now, schools can voluntarily provide vision screenings for students, but it is not required. The new law would require schools to screen their students for vision problems, using non-profits at no cost to the school.

Every Lion in the State of Arizona, as well as their families and friends, need to help get this bill passed. The main opposition came last time from the state school superintendents' association, mainly because they did not understand what the bill was all about. Fortunately this year, a friend of Richard's is taking over as head of that association and things should be different. But everyone's help is needed.

District Governors, the Council Chair, Secretaries, and others should have already received an email by the time you read this outlining the steps to follow, asking them to forward onto every club for forwarding to every Lion in our state. All it takes is an email in your own words, sent to every candidate in your legislative district, asking them if they would support vision screening in our schools. Keep track of what they say, and remind them again in 2017 when this comes up for a vote.

This is also an issue that needs to be presented at each district's kick off meetings. All it takes is between 5 and 10 minutes to read a statement. Someone is needed to assist for the 21B & 21C kickoffs. If you can help by presenting this, please email Richard at buckeyelions@yahoo.com and he will send you everything that you need.


