
LIONS NEW MEMBER INDUCTION BOARDS

Before you start the new member induction, handout the boards spread throughout the membership. These are just suggested boards that are useful as a mini-orientation while you introduce the new members to Lionism. You may create other boards with other Lions information as you choose – just make sure you make informative boards. You can make smaller induction boards on heavy-weight paper for smaller, more intimate inductions but for larger clubs you may want to make larger boards (my boards are heavyweight 14x17). You can even take them and get them laminated so they last a long time. Below are the boards I made up: Five boards for Lions – each letter on a board (put the meaning on the back):

L I O N S (Liberty, Intelligence, Our, Nation's, Safety) You can turn this into a cheer – L I O N S, Lions, Lions, We Serve!! Newer meaning: Loving, Individuals, Offering, Needed, Service

"You can't get very far until you start doing something for someone else."



A word about colors – we still use purple and gold but for print purposes, this is what LCI says:

Official Colors

Pantone Matching System (PMS) is a popular color matching system used by the printing industry to print spot colors. Most applications that support color printing allow you to specify colors by indicating the Pantone name or number. This assures that you get the right color when the file is printed, even though the color may not look right when displayed on your monitor. The following are specified Pantone colors for Lion logos:

One color logo: PMS 287 Two color logo: PMS 287 and PMS 7406

You can put just about anything on a board that is short and concise and that is a little, mini orientation type of learning experience. Have fun with it but the point is to spread the boards out around your membership so they are involved with the induction of the new member.

Make the induction short and have the sponsor pin the new Lion. You don't have to get all involved with word by word from a script, speak from the heart about the new member joining the world's largest service organization in the world. Welcome the new member as THE newest Lion in the world! Have your membership stand up and cheer and welcome the new member!
