UPDATE WITH THE MELVIN JONES INTERNATIONAL MEMORIAL Submitted by President Ralph Williamson

A special thanks goes out to the Safford Lions Club for their very large contribution which helped us to replace the Ramada canopy roof over one of the picnic benches and helped with the extra cleanup from the storms we had in the area.

We will be installing more new granite plaques on our new block walls. This is a major upgrade. The reason we are doing this is because the names on the bricks are fading due to the well water, ice, snow and longevity in the area.

We are repainting and re-organizing the interior of the museum, re-locating pictures, pens, displays etc.

There is a misconception and misunderstanding regarding our Vanguard program. Many are confusing it with the Melvin Jones Fellow Honor and say, "I am a MJF, why do I need to be a Vanguard?"

Several years ago, our outside director PCC Jack Ferguson from Missouri had the foresight of what he and others thought the Birthplace of our founder Melvin Jones should be and outlined the program called the Vanguard. Vanguard is defined as the leading position in a movement or another definition the person(s) at the forefront of any group or movement. Since this program was introduced the Board of Directors and many Lions have done their best to honor this movement.

The movement is to improve and enlarge the surroundings of Melvin's birthplace so that all Lions and the public can understand the purpose of Lions.

The Vanguard is not in competition with the Melvin Jones Fellow Honor but is a program to raise money for the future of the Museum and the area where Melvin was born. Yes you guessed it...we are in need of monetary donations to continue upgrading and making the Lions proud of the home of our founder Melvin Jones. Our donations were down last year and in many cases we cannot wait until May for the annual check presentation at state convention. Not only the MJLIM but the other state foundations only receive donations from a very small percentage of clubs in the district. We are in the process of applying with different companies and organizations for grants to upgrade the museum.

Recently, I noticed that several clubs have different type of activities and the funds from these activities go to one of the state projects. The MJLIM could also use an event to raise funds by your clubs committee. The following is our wish list:

The funds we are asking for are to replace projects that are over 20 years old.

Funds are needed to replace all the existing red bricks with the new Black Granite Plaques to relieve expenses of replacing the lettering on the bricks due to inclement weather and the hard water from the well used for irrigation. The estimated cost of this will be \$20,000.

DIABETES

The following is from the Lions Clubs International website:

Raising Diabetes Awareness, Preserving Sight - The World Health Organization estimates that over 422 million people worldwide have diabetes, a growing world epidemic that is expected to affect over 642 million by 2040.

Diabetes and Vision Loss - People with diabetes are at risk of losing sight due to diabetes eye disease. It is the leading cause of new-onset blindness in many countries. All people with diabetes – both Type 1 and Type 2 – are at risk. That's why everyone with diabetes should get a comprehensive dilated eye exam at least once a year.

Diabetes can lead to other possible complications, including heart attack, stroke, kidney failure, leg amputation, and nerve damage. In pregnancy, poorly controlled diabetes increases the risk of fetal death and other complications.

Lions and Diabetes Awareness - With these statistics and concerns in mind, Lions have taken action through the Diabetes Awareness and Action Program. Our work supports diabetes awareness, education, prevention, detection, control, and research.

Joining Forces to Fight Diabetes - Lions work with local community partners and national diabetes associations to promote diabetes education and awareness throughout the year. We also commemorate World Diabetes Day www.idf.org/wdd-index/, an annual campaign led by the International Diabetes Federation on November 14.

The following is from the EXECUTIVE SUMMARY, INTERNATIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING, Fukuoka, Japan, June 19-23, 2016:

SERVICE ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

1. Adopted a new service framework consisting of five major service platforms (diabetes, vision, environment, cancer and hunger) with special programmatic components developed for and supported by children and youth, and diabetes serving as the first signature cause.

2. Adopted that the signature cause will be for 5-10 years, and any extension beyond that timeframe will be reviewed by the Service Activities Committee.

During the past Lions year, I visited over twenty clubs in District 21-B speaking about Diabetes Awareness. My goal this Lions year is to visit clubs upon request with some experts in the field and to present some additional knowledge about this ever-increasing disease. We need to create an awareness of prediabetes – what are the signs and symptoms and what you should do.

LIONS CLUB OF GOLD CANYON ASSISTS AJHS BY REPAIRING TEXTBOOKS

Apache Junction High School social studies teacher Mr. Alec McDaniel faced a dilemma, as an AP (Advanced Placement) teacher there are curriculum resources made available but it is always a plus to have supplemental materials available. It is especially important in AP classes to have these additional resources. Mr. McDaniel had some older textbooks that were well worn and in fact in disrepair. He contacted Gold Canyon Lion Mike Weaver, who he knew from the school's Leo Club, to see if the Lions might be able to help.

Mr. Weaver brought this up at the June monthly meeting and not surprisingly Lion Loretta Milton immediately took up the challenge. Working with Gail Graham-Fisel, a volunteer at the Apache Junction Library over the next few weeks Loretta was able to remove 25 of 26 textbooks from deaths doorstep to usable resources in the classroom. The school was able to purchase a very small number of new books, since buying an entire class set was not within the budget.

Thanks to Lion Loretta and Apache Junction Library volunteer Gail Graham-Fisel, precious resources have been conserved while providing teacher resources and student enrichment

materials. Gold Canyon motto is "We Serve" and Lion Loretta exemplifies that!

Gilbert Lions Eye Screening

This year the Gilbert Lions Club took on a very aggressive project of trying to screen as many Gilbert schools as possible. Lion Bob Rimer contacted the District nurses and set up screening in 11 area schools. By contacting the Lions Vision Center, Lion Bob borrowed two Spot machines for use by the club within the schools. Lions Bob and Jeff Hoffman organized a daily schedule, using ten members and volunteers to assist. The club set out to top the previous year's total of 1,499 children screened. At the end of the two weeks of screening, the Gilbert Club processed a total of 4,158 children, not including teachers and nurses. They had a total of 459 that have been referred for further screening.

At the regular meeting on the 13th of September, several letters and emails were read to the club, showing how grateful folks were for the screening. As a bonus, we may have just picked up a few more members from the school system.
