Dear Lion:

Lions serve in a variety of ways. With any service to the public, safety is of the utmost importance. In the case of an accident or any unfortunate event, a club may be held legally responsible. Originally adopted by the U.S. Congress in 1997, the Volunteer Protection Act (VPA) provides liability protection from claims that might be filed against a nonprofit organization's individual volunteers. In the Act's current form, however, protection from liability **does not** extend to the organization itself, including Lions clubs.

Currently before Congress is another bill called the Volunteer Organization Protection Act or VOPA. This Act would amend the VPA to extend liability protection that's already given to individual volunteers to organizations as well.

We need your help in moving VOPA forward; contact your representative in support of VOPA!

- **Write** Send a letter by email, fax or mail; feel free to use this <u>sample letter</u>. We also give <u>step-by-step</u> instructions on how to contact your representative;

UPDATE WITH THE MELVIN JONES INTERNATIONAL MEMORIAL

July monsoon storms this year have been damaging the Melvin Jones International Memorial in Fort Thomas, Arizona. The Ramada over the park benches lost its metal roof on two different occasions. The first time the wind removed 3 pc of the metal roof and the second time (in less than a week) the wind removed another 4-5 pcs of the metal canopy. Last year we replaced the other canopy that was damaged the same way. Both canopies will be the same color and installed by a professional contractor. We cannot complain too much as the canopies are at least 25 years old and many of the different wires holding the roof were weak from age. This time both canopy roofs have welded brackets for the sheet metal to be fastened to. We also had a lot of branches from one of the trees break off and of course we had to pay extra to the landscaper for clean up.

We will also be installing more new granite plaques on our new block walls. This is a major upgrade. The reason we are doing this is the names on the bricks are fading due to the well water, ice, snow and longevity in the area.

I know some of you are saying, don't you have insurance to pay for the wind damage? Yes, we do, but we were told that because we had what they call a double claim on the same item. We would receive very little money with the possibility of our insurance premium being raised.

We are also repainting and re-organizing the interior of the museum re-locating pictures, pens, displays etc.

Yes you guessed it...we are in need of monetary donations to continue upgrading and making the Lions proud of the home of our founder Melvin Jones. Our donations were down last year and in many cases we cannot wait until next May for the annual check presentation at state convention. Not only the MJLIM but the other state foundations only receive donations from a very small percentage of clubs in the district. We are in the process of applying with different companies and organizations for grants to upgrade the museum.

The Safford Lions Club stepped up and donated \$2,000.00 to the MJILM and we will use it for some necessary repairs. Any donation that you can give for repairs and maintenance at this time will be greatly appreciated.

Remember we are still looking for a few good men and women to serve on our board in 21-B and 21-C. Please mark your calendars for the January 14, 2017 annual Lions re-dedication day at the MJLIM with our guest LCI 1st V.P. Dr. Naresh and his wife Navita who is also a MJF.
