HOW TO START A SERVICE PROJECT

Gain the support of the Lions in your club that they want more Service Projects. Prior to starting this process it is important to insure that the Club is behind the effort.

Form a Service Project Team and gather

information. Make a list of what your Lions are passionate about and what skills they possess. Do a Community Assessment of needs. A few conversations with community leaders asking what Service Projects are needed will identify potential needs. Ask potential clients, schools, churches, social service agencies, police, fire fighters, bus drivers, etc. about what would enhance the lives of our fellow citizens. Find out what other clubs are doing? (Just look at their Facebook pages or websites) Go to LCI and review their suggestions: <u>http://www.lionsclubs.org/EN/how-weserve/index.php</u> Go to our 21-B We Serve Facebook page for ideas: <u>https://www.facebook.com/WE-SERVE-Lions-Clubs-of-District-21-B-Southern-AZ-1487382568194138/timeline/</u>

<u>Make Decisions.</u> Invite some of your Lions to discuss the above lists and to develop an exhaustive list of all potential projects. There are no bad ideas, no limits, it is just a list of everything that comes to mind. Meet with the Club and with their input reduce this list to a small number of the best projects for YOUR club. Identify Project Managers for each Project.

Start the Project. The Project Managers should form a team, gather information, and seek advice from others who have gone before, other clubs, review the internet for information. Produce a written project plan, to include specific measurable goals, an action plan with milestones, a marketing plan, and a budget. This can be one page. Gain approval of the plan from the board or the club.

Implement. Implement the Project Plan and be prepared to adjust as you go along.

<u>Review Results.</u> Seek feedback on the project and produce a project Profit and Loss statement comparing revenues/costs/goals/results of the initial plan and the final results. Discuss the results with your club and determine what changes are appropriate for the next time.

SELL SELL SELL Let your Lions, your clients, other clubs and your community know of your project and its results and your contribution to your community through service. We no longer desire to retain our title of "the

best kept secret", while we do not brag, we do not serve in silence either, we sell our Service Success to attract sponsors, partners, clients, volunteers, supporters and potential new Lions.

*** IMPORTANT INFORMATION ***

Annual Electronic Filing Requirement for Lions Clubs

Form 990-N (e-Postcard)

Most small tax-exempt organizations whose annual <u>gross receipts</u> are <u>normally \$50,000 or less</u> are required to electronically submit Form 990-N, also known as the *e-Postcard*, unless they choose to file a complete Form 990 or Form 990-EZ instead.

If you do not file your *e-Postcard* on time, the IRS will send you a reminder notice. There is no penalty assessment for late filing the *e-Postcard*, but an organization that fails to file required *e-Postcards* (or information returns – Forms 990 or 990-EZ) for three consecutive years will <u>automatically lose its tax-exempt</u> <u>status</u>. The revocation of the organization's tax-exempt status will not take place until the filing due date of the third year.

Due Date of the e-Postcard

The *e-Postcard* is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your <u>tax year</u>. For example, if your tax year ended on December 31, the *e-Postcard* is due May 15 of the following year. If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the due date is the next business day. You cannot file the *e-Postcard* until after your tax year ends.

How to File

Use <u>this link</u> to file the *e-Postcard*. If you have trouble accessing the system using that link, you may be able to access the filing site directly by typing or pasting the following address into your Internet browser: <u>http://epostcard.form990.org</u>. When you access the system, you will leave the IRS site and file the *e-Postcard* with the IRS through our trusted partner, Urban Institute. The form must be completed and filed electronically. There is no paper form.

Information You Will Need to File the e-Postcard

The *e-Postcard* is easy to complete. All you need is <u>eight</u> items of basic information about your organization.

Who Must File

Most small tax-exempt organizations with gross receipts that are normally \$50,000 or less must file the *e*-*Postcard*. Exceptions to this requirement include:

- ✓ Organizations that are included in a group return,
- ✓ <u>Churches</u>, their integrated auxiliaries, and conventions or associations of churches, and
- Organizations required to file a different return

The South Tucson Lions Club establishes a first for District 21B – A Health Services Storefront Operation in support of the MD21 Health and Wellness Initiative.

The "Storefront Project" began as a result of a club brainstorming session aimed at determining how to best serve the community in which we serve.



One of the projects that stood out was the establishment of a storefront operation by which to provide, on an incremental basis, a variety of services to the members of the South Tucson Community and the extended community in the southern part of Tucson.

One of the first endeavors was to partner with the John Valenzuela Youth Center located in the heart of the City of South Tucson and which is under the direction of Catholic Community Services about the possibility of utilizing its facilities. The Center director readily agreed, and the club proceeded to set up the beginning of what is hoped will be a long-term effort in support of the community.

Through the efforts of committee members Lions President Fernando Acevedo, Richard Serrano, Evelyn Jacobs, ZC David Kennon, 1VDG Jim and Mary Whelan and CC Gerson and Mary Ann Gonzalez, and the support and encouragement of DG Barbara Daily, the club initiated its first South Tucson Community Health Program on Saturday August 3, 2015 with vision and diabetes screening. The eye screening was handled by certified screeners. The diabetes screening was done by the Tucson YMCA through the establishment of a partnership.

Although attendance at the first event was small, the committee is encouraged by the fact that of those attending, several were referred either to their personal doctor or to the Tucson Vision Center for exams and eyeglasses. The need in the community was evident; as a result the committee will proceed with a support from the MD21 Health and Wellness Initiative to make the community health program a fixture in the community where a variety of health information and referral services can be provided by the establishment of partnerships with other health providers in the greater Tucson community.
