



#### Diabetes Empowerment Education Program (DEEP) Curriculum Train-the-Trainer Training

#### What is DEEP?

Diabetes Empowerment Education Program (DEEP) is a licensed diabetes self-management education (DSME) curriculum developed by the University of Illinois, Chicago. DEEP was developed to provide communities with tools to better manage diabetes and is based on principles of empowerment and adult education. The purpose of this event is to train people to impart diabetes education to members of their community. Those who complete the three-day training will receive certification to conduct DSME classes in their community.

The DEEP curriculum is based on national diabetes care and DSME guidelines and recommendations. DEEP training stresses the development of skills and knowledge related to diabetes by using interactive group activities and adult-education methods. DEEP is designed as a six-week curriculum covering topics that include diabetes risk factors, complications, nutrition, physical activity, use of the glucose meter and medications, building partnerships with a diabetes healthcare team, psychosocial effects of illness, problem-solving strategies, and how to access community diabetes resources.

#### Who should attend a DEEP Train-the-Trainer training?

Staff members who work with people who have diabetes and conduct or plan to conduct DSME classes should attend.

#### Who will conduct the training?

The training will be conducted by DEEP Lead Trainers from HSAG. The training will be conducted in English, but the curriculum is also available in Spanish.

#### What is the cost?


There is no cost for the three-day training, but trainees must pay their travel, lodging, and food expenses.


