


#### **Grand Ledge Lions Club**

The flag was being removed from its home at the Courthouse for preservation in West Virginia. Well, now the flag is back home! The process took over a year to properly preserve the flag. The flag was initially made by "Ladies of Ionia," a volunteer organization composed of the mothers of members of the 21st regiment. Battle flags were one of the most important parts of a unit. Eric Calley said they are sacred and were often protected in battle.



Funds were raised to preserve and re-display the flag. The Mason Lions Club donated \$500 to the Ionia VFW toward the effort.

A NOTE FROM PDG TOM DOYLE, OD:


One of the tenets of the Lions is preservation of sight. Diabetic retinopathy is a leading cause of blindness in this nation. Your club can help in the fight against this vision-robbing disease.

Through the Tri-County Office on Aging and MSU Extension we can provide intensive education for diabetic and prediabetic patients. Often, they may feel confused or lost by the sheer amount of information they have to consider.

The larger healthcare system cannot offer the clear and comprehensive training that Lions can now help to provide. The class is called PATH and it is a 6 week program to allow patients to better understand the ins and outs of their health care, especially as it relates to diabetes.

To help your own community members, all your club needs to do is find a suitable facility for 6 weeks of use – preferably at no charge. Then, contact me, so we can set up your club's partnership with Tri-County or MSU Extension. Your club's biggest job after that is publicizing the event in your area churches, doctors' offices, pharmacies, urgent care offices, etc.

Right now, our District 11-C2 account has some funds to pay for these types of events. The St. Louis/Alma Lions Club recently completed one in their community that was an enormous success. Call me, Dr. Tom Doyle, at (517) 881-9684 if you have questions. Then, email me to arrange for a PATH class in your community at tomdoyle1225@gmail.com.





"It's a tremendous contribution to humanity and to the legacy of our founder, Melvin Jones."



The Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) is the backbone of the Lions Clubs International Foundation. It is presented to individuals who donate \$1,000 to LCIF or to people for whom a donation was made by others.

Your Lions Club can also now participate in District 11-C2's "Melvin Jones Challenge 100." Do it at your next meeting by contributing \$100 from your Club with a check made out to "District 11-C2," and send it to DG Aleta Cozart, 215 N. Shiawassee Street, P.O. Box 362, Bancroft, MI 48414. (Do not send to LCIF or LMSF, please.)

Put your Club in the running to be selected in this special Challenge. Get your chance to be able to have the District award a Melvin Jones Fellowship to the person your Club chooses. For every ten clubs participating, the District Governor will randomly select one Club to designate a recipient for a District application.





#### What LCIF can help you do for YOUR community

There are many categories of grants available from LCIF. Here's a summary list from their booklet, "Supporting Your Service" (LCIF646\_EN) available on the LCIF website). This is just a cursory description of the grants. There's lots more information on the LCIF website! Pour yourself a glass of your favorite beverage and settle back for a couple of hours of fascinating exploring! <a href="https://www.lionsclubs.org/en">https://www.lionsclubs.org/en</a>, then click on **LCIF** at the top of the page.

- **Disaster Relief: Emergency, Emergency Preparedness**, and **Major Catastrophe** grants. Flooding, tornadoes, and major fires are a few examples of eligible situations.
- **Childhood cancer** grants: construction and expansion of things like family homes, child-friendly areas at cancer treatment centers, transportation, education, and recreation.
- **Diabetes** grants we've been benefiting from one of these grants for several years through the efforts of PDG Dr. Tom Doyle and the Defense Against Diabetes program he has championed. Other applications include screening initiatives, follow-up care, enhancing diabetes camps, expanding existing health facilities for more patient access, and training for health personnel.
- **District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCG)** clubs that donate \$5,000 and districts that donate \$10,000 in one year can get back a portion of that money for community projects. Currently a little over \$5000 is available to the district in this program.
- **Lions Quest** Program, Promotional, and Community Partnership grants to build a Quest program in your community.
- **Matching grants** to fund construction and equipment costs to expand Lions projects addressing critical human and social needs.
- **Vision** grants help fight major causes of preventable and reversible blindness and provide services to those who are already blind or visually impaired.
- **Leo Service Pilot** grant program support Leos in assessing, planning, and implementing their own service projects.

Each of these grant types has its own application and implementation procedures. If you are interested in pursuing any of these, you can contact me (email below).

You may be wondering how to go about obtaining any of these grants. For starters, you can read the pamphlet "10 Tips: Applying for LCIF Grants" (LCIF639\_EN). You will note that many grants are processed at the district level, so District Governor Aleta Cozart would be part of the application process.

Lions will learn how to assemble and use their own publicity toolkit - a practical easy guide to crafting compelling stories about a club's service activities and effectively engaging with local news media.








#### **Chrissy Andre**

Bear Lake depends on people who keep camp running with steady work that often happens out of view. Our Food Service Director, Chrissy Andre, is one of those individuals. She first helped in the kitchen during a weekend in 2021. By the next summer she had joined the staff year round and her role has continued to expand with the needs of our programs. This year the kitchen prepared more than twenty five thousand five hundred meals for more than three thousand five hundred visitors. Organizing that amount of activity requires structure, planning, and support for a team that works long days through summer youth sessions, rentals, and leadership programs. The dining hall remains a welcoming place for campers because of the consistency built into that work. During the offseason, Chrissy oversees meals for quilting retreats, crafting weekends, and school groups. These events bring a different rhythm, and the goal is always the same. Create a space where guests feel comfortable and cared for. Chrissy also assists with several communication and outreach efforts. She prepares the monthly newsletter, helps maintain social media and website information, and coordinates the Annual Ice Plunge, which continues to grow as a key fundraiser for camp. Her work touches many areas and supports the mission in ways that help each season run smoothly. We appreciate the dedication she brings to every part of her role.



#### **Radio PSAs for Your Lions Club**

While much of our publicity emphasis is on getting stories of our service projects on local television news, there is another medium we may tend to overlook. Radio public service announcements (PSAs) are a powerful, cost-effective way to reach a broad audience with your Lions Club's message.

Whether you're promoting a fundraising event, recruiting new members, or highlighting your community service, radio PSAs help amplify your impact and connect with people who might not otherwise hear about your club's work. Let's explore the basics of radio PSAs.

A radio PSA is a short message, typically 15 to 60 seconds, broadcast for free by radio stations to inform the public about nonprofit activities or events. Because stations are required to serve their communities, they're often eager to air content from service organizations like Lions Clubs.

To craft effective radio public service announcements:

- Keep It Short and Simple: Focus on one clear message. Mention your club's name, the purpose (e.g., "Join us for our KidSight vision screening"), and any important details.
- Include a Call to Action: Tell listeners exactly what you want them to do—attend an event, visit a website, or contact your club for more information.
- Use Conversational Language: Write like you speak, making it friendly and easy for listeners to understand and remember.
- Practice and Time It: Make sure your script fits within the station's time limits. Practice reading your PSA aloud for pace and clarity.

Here are some tips for getting your PSA on the air:

- Identify Local Stations: Research radio stations in your area, including both commercial and community outlets.
- Contact the Right Person: Reach out to the station's public affairs director or PSA coordinator. A friendly phone call or email can go a long way.
- Follow Submission Guidelines: Each station may have specific requirements for PSA length, format, and delivery (e.g., written script, audio file). Ask for details and tailor your submission accordingly.
- Be Timely: Submit your PSA at least two to four weeks before your event or campaign to allow time for scheduling.
- Express Appreciation: Thank station staff for their support. Building a good relationship increases your chances of future airplay.

After your PSA airs, maximize its impact beyond the airwaves. Leverage its momentum by sharing the audio or script on your Lions Club's website and social media. Encourage members to listen and spread the word. Consider collaborating with local partners to further amplify your message.

Here is a short PSA script as an example:

"This is the Charlotte Lions Club inviting you to our Lions Strides for Diabetes Awareness walk starting at 9 AM on Saturday, March 21, at Bennet Park. If you or someone you know have been affected by diabetes, support local programs and enjoy a great day with family and friends. Learn more at CharlotteLionsClub.org or call (517) 555-1234. We hope to see you there!"

Check out Section 10 of the Localeyes Publicity Toolkit for more examples – provided by Lion Roger Yoder. Effective use of radio PSAs can enhance your Lions Club's reputation, boost event attendance, and attract new members. With thoughtful planning and outreach, your message can reach far beyond the club—and make an even greater difference in your community.
