





Lions Clubs throughout the District did bellringing for the Salvation Army this Christmas season. The **Mason Lions Club** teamed up with the Mason Optimist Club. They reported Mason results:

"After making the final deposit from the 2025 Bell Ringing season, 28 Optimist and 8 Lion Club members rang 52 hours at 3 locations (Quality Dairy, Dollar Tree, and Darrell's Market) over 3 Friday evening-Saturday weekends to provide the Mason community the opportunity to support the Salvation Army with \$2,829.32 in cash and \$200 in individual checks plus what the clubs may supplement from club budgets. The \$3,029.32 total exceeds the 2024 effort of \$2,447.85 and is the third highest total since 2012. The Mason community has provided an estimated \$97,041.53, to date, via the bell ringing each year beginning with \$600 in 1974. The Mason Optimist Club is spreading the news and extending its appreciation to the **Mason Lions Club**."

#### A NOTE FROM PDG TOM DOYLE, OD:

One of the tenets of the Lions is preservation of sight. Diabetic retinopathy is a leading cause of blindness in this nation. Your club can help in the fight against this vision-robbing disease.

Through the Tri-County Office on Aging and MSU Extension we can provide intensive education for diabetic and prediabetic patients. Often, they may feel confused or lost by the sheer amount of information they have to consider.

The larger healthcare system cannot offer the clear and comprehensive training that Lions can now help to provide. The class is called PATH and it is a 6-week program to allow patients to better understand the ins and outs of their health care, especially as it relates to diabetes.

To help your own community members, all your club needs to do is find a suitable facility for 6 weeks of use – preferably at no charge. Then, contact me, so we can set up your club's partnership with Tri-County or MSU Extension. Your club's biggest job after that is publicizing the event in your area churches, doctors' offices, pharmacies, urgent care offices, etc.

Right now, our District 11-C2 account has some funds to pay for these types of events. The St. Louis/Alma Lions Club completed one in their community that was an enormous success. ## **What LCIF can help you do for YOUR community**

There are many categories of grants available from LCIF. Here's a summary list from their booklet, "Supporting Your Service" (LCIF646\_EN) available on the LCIF website). This is just a cursory description of the grants. There's lots more information on the LCIF website! Pour yourself a glass of your favorite beverage and settle back for a couple of hours of fascinating exploring! <https://www.lionsclubs.org/en> , then click on **LCIF** at the top of the page.

### **Disaster Relief: Emergency, Emergency Preparedness, and Major Catastrophe grants.**

Flooding, tornadoes, and major fires are a few examples of eligible situations.

**Childhood cancer** grants: construction and expansion of things like family homes, child-friendly areas at cancer treatment centers, transportation, education, and recreation.

**Diabetes** grants – we've been benefiting from one of these grants for several years through the efforts of PDG Dr. Tom Doyle and the Defense Against Diabetes program he has championed. Other applications include screening initiatives, follow-up care, enhancing diabetes camps, expanding existing health facilities for more patient access, and training for health personnel.

**District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCG)** – clubs that donate \$5,000 and districts that donate \$10,000 in one year can get back a portion of that money for community projects. Currently a little over \$5000 is available to the district in this program.

**Lions Quest** – Program, Promotional, and Community Partnership grants to build a Quest program in your community.

**Matching grants** to fund construction and equipment costs to expand Lions projects addressing critical human and social needs.

**Vision** grants – help fight major causes of preventable and reversible blindness and provide services to those who are already blind or visually impaired.

**Leo Service Pilot** grant program – support Leos in assessing, planning, and implementing their own service projects.

Each of these grant types has its own application and implementation procedures. If you are interested in pursuing any of these, you can contact me (email below).

You may be wondering how to go about obtaining any of these grants. For starters, you can read the pamphlet "10 Tips: Applying for LCIF Grants" (LCIF639\_EN). You will note that many grants are processed at the district level, so District Governor Aleta Cozart would be part of the application process.




### **What Can You Do to Help?**



# STOP THE DROPS

December & June drops are often the result of clubs purging their rosters before the semi-annual billing deadlines. But that behavior is symptomatic, not the root cause. Let's stop the drops by addressing both prevention & perception.

## DECEMBER & JUNE DROPS HAPPEN BECAUSE:

- Clubs don't want to pay for inactive members.
- Members feel disconnected or unengaged or unheard or unappreciated.
- There's a "clean-up culture" rather than a renewal mindset.

## Engage Now - Before the Drop

### IDENTIFY AT-RISK MEMBERS

- Who hasn't attended meetings?
- Who hasn't participated in service?
- Who might drop?
- Check in personally with every member now.
- Ask why they have become distant or might be considering leaving – & listen without judgment.
- Offer flexible dues payment options (installments, sponsorships, or club-level assistance funds).
- Use this as a chance to re-sell the value of being a Lion: friendship, purpose, impact & connection.

### REACTIVATE THROUGH SERVICE

Promote a December service project where **EVERY** member has a role, even if it's small.

**MEASURABLE GOAL** - At least one contact/engagement for every Lion by November 30.

**Let's make every Lion proud to stay a Lion.**

# Starting Your Lions Club Podcast

For some time, we've been working on crafting our personal Lions Club stories that are engaging in face-to-face conversations we have that include discussions on potential membership. Now, imagine a new way to share your Lions story that feels almost as personal and welcoming, but it is not quite face to face. It is a medium that your community will find easy to enjoy while driving to work, walking the dog, or making dinner. That's the power of a podcast—and it's an opportunity perfectly suited for your local Lions Club.

A podcast is simply a series of recorded personal conversations that people can listen to on their phones, computers, or smart speakers. It is akin to giving your neighbors permission to eavesdrop on what you are talking about with another person or persons. For a community service organization like yours, it can become a friendly "voice" of your Lions Club, helping you connect with neighbors, partners, and potential members in a meaningful way.

## Sharing Our Story of Service

Your Lions Club does great work, but only a small number in your community may see it firsthand. A podcast lets you explain *why* Lions do what we do, not just *what* we do. Episodes could highlight recent service projects or tell the story behind a long-standing Lions Club tradition. When people hear enthusiasm and commitment in our voices, our service becomes more relatable and inspiring.

Your Lions Club's podcasts don't have to be formal or complicated. One host—perhaps rotating among members—can interview fellow Lions, community leaders, school officials, or recipients of our service. These conversations highlight partnerships and remind listeners that Lions are deeply woven into the fabric of your local community. It also gives local organizations a reason to share your content with their own audiences.

Not everyone reads our newsletters or attends your meetings, but many people enjoy listening. A podcast can reach beyond your usual channels and complement what we already do online. Episodes can be shared on your Facebook page, linked to our E-Clubhouse website, and mentioned in newsletters and publicity releases. Each episode becomes reusable content that continues working for your Lions Club long after it's recorded.

## Podcasts Attract New Members

People often hesitate to join their local Lions Club because they don't know what a meeting is like or whether they'd fit in. Hearing real members talk casually about service, fellowship, and fun can remove that uncertainty. A podcast helps potential members feel like they already know us before they ever walk into a meeting.

Starting a podcast doesn't require a studio or technical expertise. A quiet room, a basic microphone, and free or low-cost recording software are enough to begin. Episodes can be short—15 to 20 minutes—and published once or twice a month. As comfort grows, so can the format and frequency.

At its heart, a Lions Club podcast is another form of service: informing, connecting, and strengthening your ties to your community. By giving your club a consistent voice, you can amplify our mission, celebrate our impact, and invite others to join us in making a difference. A podcast won't replace what you already do—but it is a fine addition in helping more people hear about what you do!
