

Get Ready Now for "Celebrate Community 2025"

"Celebrate Community" is a joint initiative of the four major volunteer service organizations that focuses on community needs, which took place for the fourth year in September 2024. The global organizations – Kiwanis International, Lions Clubs International, Optimist International, and Rotary International – first collaborated in 2021 to promote local joint service projects.



This annual public effort encourages clubs to reach out to one another to work together on projects that improve and benefit their local communities. Not content to just share space on the welcome sign when people drive into town, we've cooperated to help and also raised our club's local visibility. Over the four years we've been doing this in Mason, Michigan, our four local clubs have raised thousands of dollars to help worthy community causes.



In 2021, Mason, Michigan service clubs worked together to raise funds for the annual CROP Hunger Walk in Mason. In 2022, the clubs raised money for the Sparrow Hair-a-Thon Thon and Maggie's Wigs 4 Kids of Michigan for Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. In 2023, the donations went to two organizations: the Friends of the Mason Library and the Mason Area Historical Society.



Both the Library and Museum were continuing to undergo renovations, so Celebrate Community 2024 in Mason was an extension of the 2023 fundraising efforts. Our service clubs again helped to make sure the two buildings continue their important work in preserving Mason's cultural heritage.



As in past years, a "Celebrate Community" fundraising kit was given to each club. The 2024 kit had a poster, easel, handouts, and two donation jars – each with an election theme with "Vote for Team Museum" and "Vote for Team Library." Clubs could choose their own ways to contribute, however. Passing the donation jars around at club meetings, making a club donation, and encouraging larger donations from individual members were the most popular.

The Mason Area Historical Society and The Friends of the Mason Library are both 501c3 nonprofit organizations and also received funds directly from individuals in the community as part of this campaign. We requested that the nonprofits inform the appropriate service organization if donations were made in the name of one of our clubs.

Some donors made large contributions in the name of a service club, even though they were not a member of any club at all. It seems folks in Mason realize that service clubs are the heart of our communities. They know that so many people each year depend on our clubs' service and support.

We all know that we can make an even bigger impact when we work together. What will be our focus for this coming September? That has yet to be determined. However, now is the time to begin to discuss ideas. What ideas do you have for a joint project to help your area's local clubs "Celebrate Community" in 2025?
