From the desk of the Governor






St. Johns Lions Club


Mason Middle School Leo Club



Choosing the Best Writing Style

In today's fast-paced world, effective communication is key. Whether drafting an e-mail to Lions Club members, a news release, or a social media post, selecting the right writing style can determine how well your message is received. But with so many styles to choose from—business, trade, legal, feature, and more, how do you know which is best for your audience?

Each writing style serves a distinct purpose, catering to different audiences and mediums:

- **Business Style**: Used for reports, executive summaries, and formal memos, this style is structured, concise, and professional.
- **Personal Style**: Common in informal club communications, such as notes and e-mails between members, fostering a friendly tone.
- Familiar Style: Often used in newsletters or other internal communications, this style aims to engage and unify teams
- **Insider Style**: Tailored for Lions-specific audiences, this style includes acronyms and jargon and assumes the reader's familiarity with those terms.
- **Straight-News Style**: The go-to format for news releases and some external communications, it follows journalistic standards of objectivity and clarity.
- **Feature Style**: Used for storytelling in newsletters and blogs, this style is engaging, often beginning with a compelling lead before delivering key information.
- **Legal Style**: Crucial in crisis communication, ensuring statements are precise and legally sound to protect the Lions Club and other parts of our larger association.

Your writing style should align not only with your audience but also with the corresponding communication channel:

- TV and Electronic Media: Keep it brief, clear, and descriptive to create a vivid picture for viewers or listeners.
- Internal Newsletters and Magazines: Follow norms, incorporating sections like "Trends" or "New Service Projects" when applicable.
- Influencers, Podcast Commentators & Columnists: Adapt to their unique preferences and editorial tones.
- Other Regional and Local Media: Acknowledge the culture, values, and terminology of people in your area for better resonance.

Before choosing a writing style, consider:

- Who is your audience? Are they internal or external? Familiar or unfamiliar with your Lions Club and the larger association?
- What is their knowledge level? Are they experts in your writing subject or do they need background information?
- How interested are they? Will they actively seek out your message, or do you need to capture their attention?
- What is the purpose of the message? Is it to inform, persuade, entertain, or clarify a position?

Public relations writing should balance credibility with loyalty to the norms of your Lions Club and Lions International. Gather accurate information that serves your Lions Club's interests while keeping the needs of the media—and ultimately, readers, listeners, or viewers—in mind.

Writing is not one-size-fits-all. Selecting the right style ensures your message is not only understood but also well-received. By assessing your audience, medium, and objectives, you can craft compelling, effective communications that leave a lasting impact.
