


# SAVE THE DATE for the 2025 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION



#### See Your Way Clear to Recycle

For many years, Lions Clubs have promoted our well-known service program for recycling old eyeglasses and hearing aids. The program is often included in our Lions Club's publicity about our participation in local events. If we have a booth at a public event or festival, we will often include a request for the public to stop by and drop off those items for recycling. However, while a few members of the public do bring their items to our booth, most either forget or consider it a bit of a hassle.

For the past couple of years, the Mason Lions Club has tested a way to further boost our community's donations of used eyeglasses and hearing aids. At our Down Home Days and Spring Fling Courthouse Shows and other local community events, our Mason Lions Club has come up with a simple giveaway – a clear plastic bag – that is working very well.

Each bag we give out has a note enclosed. One side of the note has the names of the downtown Mason locations of our eyeglasses and hearing aid drop boxes. The other side of the note is a promotion for joining our Lions Club. Since these zipper bags are resealable, they work well to keep old eyeglasses and hearing aids that people have collected for recycling well contained while traveling to one of our Lions drop boxes.

We give out clear zipper bags that feature a built-in, die-cut handle. Die-cut carrying handles allow the bag to be held comfortably, just like a shopping bag. They're the perfect bag for our Lions Club to give out at shows and conferences because they are also great for carrying giveaways and brochures.



It is easy to get people to take them as they walk by our booth because we just ask them if they have any old eyeglasses laying around their house. Most answer in the affirmative! They are then given the bag and are told to put their old glasses and hearing aids in the bag as we point out the note inside and explain that they can just bring it to one of our drop boxes later when it is convenient.

After trying out several clear plastic bags from various vendors, our Lions Club began to have concerns about the giveaway plastic bags hurting the environment. (After all, besides vision assistance, environmental protection is another one of Lions causes!) We now purchase 9 x 12, 3 mil clear die cut handle biodegradable zipper bags from a vendor that sells them at a cost of around a quarter for each bag. That makes it a giveaway that is also quite low in cost.

The vendor stresses that it is focusing more on their environmental footprint, without sacrificing quality. All their zipper handle bags are made from 30% recycled materials and are reusable. The biodegradable bags maintain the same feel and quality as standard plastic bags because they mix recycled materials with virgin polyethylene scraps. In this way, they strive to be eco-conscious while also offering high-quality products.

These clear bags are also produced with a D2W additive which make them biodegradable. D2W is made from a by-product of oil refining which used to go to waste. Instead of wasting it, the company captures that waste and produces plastic instead of flaring it off. This D2W is then added to the plastic in these die-cut handle bags which renders them degradable. D2W degradable plastic can still be reused and recycled. The bonus of it is that it will also degrade much quicker and disappear completely in a short timeframe, leaving no harmful residues in our landfills.

The plastic bags are easy to reuse. They make for the perfect gift baggies for any event! At our last Lions Club picnic, we gave out door prizes of water bottles with a Lion drink mix, both enclosed in one of our plastic bags. Whether you're celebrating a bridal shower, a birthday party, or a graduation, the bags give you the flexibility to create many gift bags for your guests.

The resealable plastic bags with handles are great for packing and carrying a lunch as well. The 9 x 12 plastic bags we give out are also good for professional sporting events because they meet the NFL's guidelines for clear stadium bags. These plastic bags are ideal for keeping items secure at games while also allowing for quick passage through security.

Enough about reuse, though. Most importantly, they accomplish well their original use and get more community members involved with our recycling of eyeglasses and hearing aids.
