Writing With Style

Most of our Lions Club work in publicity and promotion will likely require that we start by writing something down. The final format of our promotional messages will vary by the type of media and intended audience. However, it is often a good idea to start by composing something more akin to a long news-like release or blog post. A multiparagraph comprehensive piece of writing will then allow you to edit and reformat your message into whatever form you might eventually need.

In future articles, I'll cover ways to convert your long message into this variety of formats and shorter versions. I'll also discuss which to use for what. You'll then be able to work all the way down to a mere caption or headline. But before we get into that, let's talk about writing style for your bigger piece of writing.

First, forget what you learned in composition class. You're not writing an essay or a short story. Sure, most "Elements of Style" you may have learned in school will always help make your writing clearer and more understandable. But consider forgetting what you learned about the many more specific details of writing in MLA, Chicago, or APA style.

Instead, use newswriting style in your longer composition. It provides you with writing that is clear, concise, and objective. The "gold standard" is AP style, used by the Associated Press. I will discuss more about that specific style in a later article also.

In general, newswriting style will serve you best in converting the longer piece into a news release for sure, but it also will help you organize you Facebook posts, talking points, and other written material. It also helps you to avoid writing in the first-person using pronouns such as "I" and "we." This is done to maintain objectivity and to ensure that the focus is on the facts, not on the writer's own perspective.

The inverted pyramid is a newswriting structure that puts the most important and essential information in the first several sentences and then explanatory details and less important information are written in subsequent paragraphs. Newswriting style is also characterized by the following features:

- Fact-based writing, not opinions or interpretations.
 Clear and easy to understand.
- Strives to be objective and avoids expressing personal opinions or beliefs.
- Ensures accuracy and writing free of errors.
- Concise and to the point.
- Timely and up to date.

You can use a variety of techniques to achieve these goals, including:

- Use direct quotes to give readers a sense of what people involved in a story said. Direct quotes should be used when they make sense to include however, and they should always be attributed to a particular speaker.
- If possible, attribute information to a source. This means identifying the person or organization that provided the information.
- Always fact-check. This means verifying the information with multiple sources and checking for accuracy.

Newswriting is an important skill for anyone who wants to work in public communication. Here are some additional tips for writing in newswriting style:

- Use strong verbs and active voice.
- Avoid jargon and technical terms.
- Use simple, everyday language.

- Be specific and avoid generalizations.
- Proofread your work carefully before submitting it.


