SafeCenter now serves all gender identities who have experienced intimate partner domestic violence or sexual assault.

SafeCenter works with many community partners including law enforcement, social service agencies, schools and the healthcare community to prevent violence and promote justice and healing for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault.

Educate. Prevent. Advocate. Empower.

#### **Our Vision:**

End domestic violence and sexual assault.

#### **Emergency Shelter:**

SafeCenter provides temporary and safe housing for women and children. While in shelter survivors are provided with meals, personal care items, advocacy, and counseling. We do not currently house adult men, but we are happy to assist male survivors with finding a safe place.




