

IN REMEMBRANCE OF RON MOSS



We are sad to announce the passing of a great Lion and long-time member of Cereal City Host Lions Club. For those of you who are not familiar with the Host Lions, it is a very small club that raises the majority of its funds by publishing a newspaper each year. At one time, Host boasted over 100 members and was instrumental in the formation of Battle Creek Cereal City Lions Club so we have a history of being together.

Ronald Dale "Ron" Moss, 83, a lifelong Battle Creek, Michigan resident died peacefully with his family at his side, on Monday, January 17, 2022.

Ron was born October 3, 1938, in Battle Creek, Michigan the son of Ralph D. and Margaret J. (Brown) Moss. He was a 1957 graduate of Battle Creek Central High School. He grew up working at his parents Sip-n-Nip Drive Inn. While in high school he met the love of his life, Elizabeth "Tootsie" Verga. They were married May 24, 1959, and spent 59 years together.

Ron was employed at Clark Equipment Company for ten years, prior to 1968, when he purchased Hoff's Hardware in Wattles Park. In 1986, he and his wife purchased Moss's Grocery in Burley Corners and shortly after moved to Loon Lake.

He retired in 2001. After retirement, he and his wife spent time traveling and spending time with their children and grandchildren.

Ron was one of the founding members of Automotive Engineering Club, which was super-modified race cars in the 1950's. He was involved with Boy Scouts, Wattles Park Men's Club, Lions Club and the Battle Creek Regional History Museum. He enjoyed golfing and fishing.

Surviving are his sons, Timothy (Teresa) Moss and Mark (Cindy) Moss all of Battle Creek, MI; daughter, Donna (Tom Wood) Bray of Cape Coral, FL; six grandsons, Bret (Kerri) Moss, Kurt (Stephanie) Moss, Nicholas (Cherielynn) Moss, Matthew (Jessica) Moss, Samuel (Natalie) Bray and Caleb Bray; eight greatgrandchildren, Paige, Adelyn, Brynlee, Lucy, Taylorfaye, Caysen and Torilynn; and Treyson. Ron was preceded in death by his wife, Elizabeth on September 1, 2018; his parents, Ralph and Margaret and two brothers, Ralph "Donnie" Moss and Darwin Moss.

This contest is to determine the District, Region and Zone Club of the Year to be presented at the District Convention. It will run from February 1, 2021 to February 1, 2022. All entries are to be submitted to District Cabinet Secretary by February 15, 2022.

SERVICE TO COMMUNITY:

- 1. Twenty (20) points for providing funds to a community agency within our district. (Maximum 40 points) Example: Red Cross, food bank, church, etc.
- 2. Fifty (50) points for sponsoring a Peace Poster Contestant.
- 3. Ten (10) points for each pair of glasses provided. (Max 100 points)
- 4. Ten (10) points for donations given to Youth Activities. Example: scouts, athletic teams, youth clubs, Leos, etc. (Maximum 50 points)
- 5. Ten (10) points for donations to individuals, i.e. scholarships, travel or accessibility needs.(Maximum 50 points)
- 6. Ten (10) points for club involvement in community improvement projects. (Maximum 40 points)
- 7. Fifty (50) points for holding a KidSight/SPOT Screening. (Maximum 200 points)
- 8. Twenty (20) points for having a Lions Mint Dispenser in your community. (Max 40 points)
- 9. Ten (10) points for each eyeglass collection site set up in your community. (Maximum 40 points)
- 10. Twenty (20) points for sponsoring a Diabetes Awareness session in your community.

SERVICE TO THE LIONS:

- 11. Fifty (50) points for each member serving on the District Cabinet.
- 12. Twenty Five (25) points for each member chairing a District Committee.
- 13. Twenty (20) points for each District 11-B1 All State Band member financially supported by your club.
- 14. Ten (10) points for submitting your club newsletter or news stories to the District Newsletter Editor. (Max 50 points)


Keynote Address: Sandy Pearson, President/CEO Habitat for Humanity




