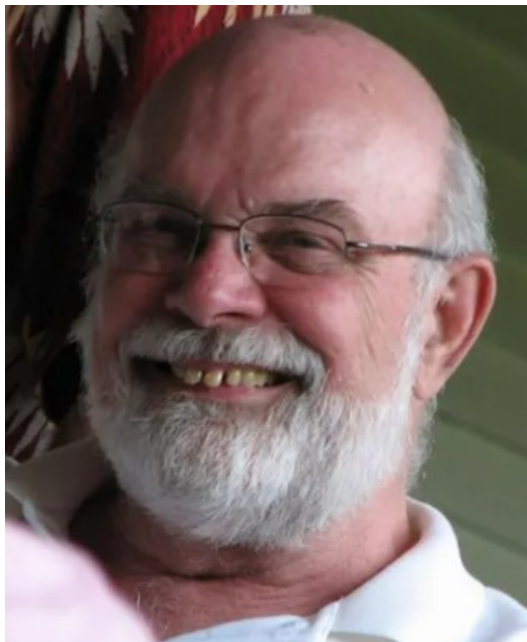

Remember what George would say, "Have a good life!" May he rest in peace.

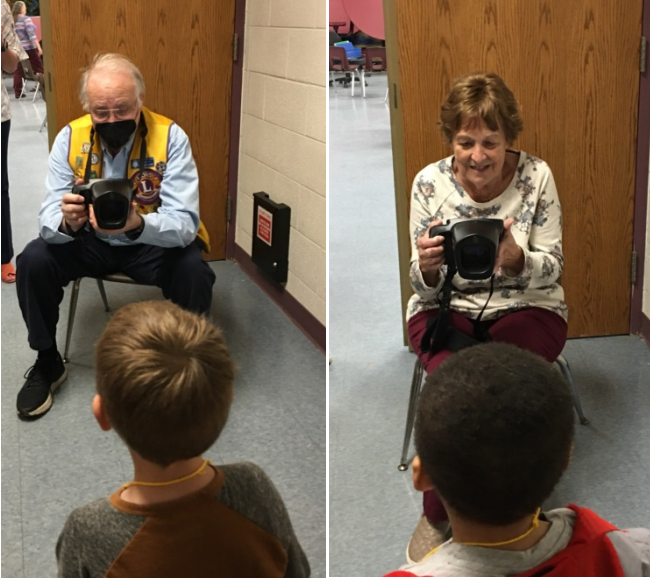
During the 2021-22 Lions year, Dexter added 20 new members!! Orientation meetings are being held at the home of PDG Terry Walters.

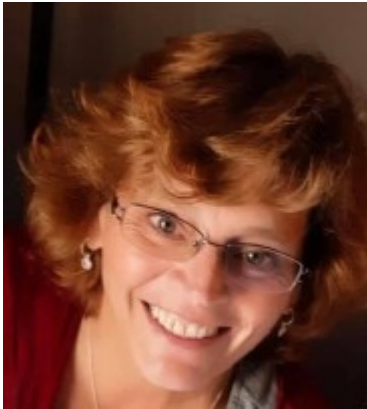
