




Pittsford Lion's Peace Poster Essay Winner Takes Top Honors in State!

When Pittsford Lions sponsored the Lions Club International Peace Poster and Essay Contest at the Pittsford Area Schools, they landed a winner. Peace essay writer Gia Jackson, using this year's theme "Peace, Love and Understanding," took 1st place at the local contest. Her entry went on to take 1st place at the District 11-B1 level and 1st place at the State competition.

The essay part of the contest is for visually impaired students. Jackie Salazar, who assists Gia in school, received a certificate of appreciation and a check for \$50 for the Gia Jackson Fund. Gia's essay will now go on to the International competition to be voted on there. Gia's essay was recently featured in the Lions of MI 'Lion Pride' December issue.

Pittsford Lions Peace Poster Contest was won by Hana Norris and she received a winner's certificate and a check for \$50. Gabby Richards won second place and \$35. Third place was Jaidyn Hinkley and she won \$20. Hana Norris went on to win first place at the district level for another \$100 prize!

Pittsford Schools Art Teacher Jack McDonough conducted the contest and received a Certificate of Appreciation and \$100.00 for the Pittsford Schools Art Department. 

Pennfield Lions Club would like express our sincere thanks to everyone, especially, the students and staff of Pennfield Schools, community members, and many volunteers who donated toward and collected non-perishable food products to supply 60 families including 167 children. Each family received additional items for a Turkey Dinner on Christmas, as part of the Christmas Basket.

The North and Purdy Elementary schools did a great job again, as well as Dunlap Elementary (Grades 3-5) held a Penny Wars, which is a competition between classes to raise funds for the purchase of the perishable products for the families Christmas meal. This year the Dunlap Elementary "Penny Wars" contributed \$ 635.05. Middle school sponsored 3 PJ & 2 hat days. Students could donate a dollar to wear the Pajamas and on Hat day their hat. The Middle School (Grades 6-8) "Pajamas/Hat Day Fundraiser" contributed \$ 529.28.

Pennfield High School students, teachers and administration all pitched in to help with 2014 Pennfield Lions Food Drive. The High School group was able to raise over \$ 345.50 for this great cause and they also brought in many boxes of canned goods. Many students helped out and were involved with several direct matching fund challenges from Mr. Tom Faber, HS Assistant Principal. Teachers in first hour classes organized their classes this year in a small competition to make this an enjoyable experience. Mrs. Schneiderhan led her class to first place with 413 points, Mr. Koenigsknecht's class was second place with 406 points. Mrs. Nolin's class was third place with 375 points. Mr. Forton's class was fourth place with 154 points, and taking fifth place with 115 points was Mrs. Haroff's class. All in all, it was a fun and exciting way for our students to give back to the community and help others at this special time of year.

In addition, this year, the Pennfield Bus Drivers donated monies toward the purchase of food for our baskets. Pennfield Schools Education Foundation (PSEF) sponsored several families. Bailey Park Auto, Garry Johnson's family, Pennfield Technology Dept., each sponsored a complete family, as well as, James King. Ernie Lahusky State Farm office, Roger & Sharon Spriggel, Julie & Don Root family, Dr. D.W. 


