From the Governor

DG Dave Hill, Vandercook Lake Lions

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S GOALS AND OBJECTIVES FOR THE NEXT YEAR

Nancy and I just got back from the International Convention in Japan. I heard that as many as 40,000 Lions attended the convention from all over the world. The Centennial Convention will be in Chicago next year, and I would encourage all of you to attend and march in the parade. If you go to the following web address you can read about next year's convention:

During the last year I have attended state, regional and international training in preparation to become District Governor. We also completed six online classes. We spent quite a bit of time developing goals for our districts. The following are the primary goals for District 11-B1 in the next year:

- 1. CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OUR COMMUNITIES -Each club has the best perspective of how to serve their communities. Our International President's wife, Dianne Corlew, has asked that each club do something for our local schools. I believe that every club has multiple programs for your local schools. Among the programs that I am familiar with are we are purchasing glasses for needy students, we currently have six Leos Clubs, we have reading programs that we support, we contribute books and supplies, and we support school events with food and service. We currently support six Leo Clubs, and I would like to add one new Leo Club in the next year. I encourage each club to discuss how you can provide further support to your schools in the next year. Please include any service to your schools on your monthly reports.
- 2. CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OUR MEMBERS I have always been impressed by the support our clubs provide for their members when they are experiencing difficult times. Please continue to keep this an upmost goal of your club. When a Lion needs help and support, we should be there for them.

- 3. LEADERSHIP AND SUCCESSION PLANNING We are going to establish a District Leadership Academy to provide training to Lions whose club believes will be future leaders. Members of the Academy will be assigned a Guiding Lion and a training program will be developed for them. The program will include attendance to Lion Forums (to include Higgins Lake, District Spring Training, Michigan Forum, District and State Conventions, etc.), Lions online training, District Leadership positions, etc. We will develop a five-year succession management program which will include the Academy members.
- 4. CLUB RETENTION AND MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT We are going to classify all clubs as red (under 10 members), amber (10 to 20 members, and green (20 or more members). Those clubs in the red zone will be assigned a Guiding Lion and will be eligible for extra assistance from the district. We will publish the list of the clubs and their status in the August Newsletter and publish an update quarterly.

5. MEMBERSHIP

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S LETTER CAMPAIGN - I am planning to visit each club and would like each club to provide me with a list of five or more people they think would make good Lions. I will personally send each of them a written invitation and tell them that a Lion will contact them to see if they can attend an upcoming meeting.

CENTENNIAL LIONS CLUB INITIATIVE - All Lions who recruit a new member to their Lions Club will receive a Centennial Sponsor Pin, and the new member will receive a special member pin with a rocker on top saying "Centennial".

The Grass Lake Lions have been actively supporting a local group dedicated to build a museum that is dedicated to street cars. We met with the group in June to discuss a partnership and are in the process of scheduling a follow up meeting.





CAMPUS LIONS CLUBS - Despite the fact that our district contains several colleges and Universities, we do not have any campus clubs. In 2015 the University of Michigan had 2831 students from China, 829 students from India, 541 students from South Korea and 239 students from Taiwan. Membership in the Lions is extremely strong in these countries and considered quite prestigious. While I was at the International Convention, I was able to contact PID A.P. Singh of India and PID Sang-Do Lee of South Korea. Both have agreed to provide us with a letter that addresses the advantages of becoming a Lion in their countries and a video that I can provide to the India and China student organizations at the University of Michigan. We will present the letters to the organizations and ask that they share the information on social media. We will set up a Facebook page for each new potential club and have an organizational dinner for each if we have students show interest. I have also sent a letter to PDG Chitnis in New Jersey to see if he can provide support. PDG Chitnis speaks fluent Hindi and visits India on a regular basis for his business. I was able to have a meeting with Ms. Tamara Ivetic and Ms. Mindy Marks who are part of the staff at the International Headquarters concerning starting a campus club for Chinese students and Taiwan students. Lions Clubs charters for China are issued by the Chinese government, and I needed some guidance before trying to contact the Chinese Lions. Tamara and Mindy asked me to send a copy of a proposal letter, and they will talk with the Lion in Hong Kong who successfully negotiated the Lions being introduced to China. It is worth mentioning that the Lions are the only service club allowed in China. Tamara and Mindy are also going to provide me with a point of contact for Taiwan. In addition, I will be sending letters to three points of contact in the medical school of the University of Michigan to ask for their support to start a campus club with interests in the medical field. Eastern Michigan University has a large Hispanic population, and I have asked a Hispanic Lions Club in

Detroit to help us with a plan for a campus club; however, they have not responded. I will continue to work on this. If we are able to get interest from students, I will be asking clubs to contribute to a fund to reduce the cost of membership for the students. Currently, is costs a student member about \$40 a year in dues. It would be nice if we could reduce this to \$20. These students will be the leaders of tomorrow. Making them Lions could positively affect thousands of people in the future.

NEW CLUB EXPLORATION - Last year I met with the Director of the Dahlem Nature Center, Rod Malloy, in Summit Township to discuss starting a Lions Club among their volunteers. Rod was very interested; however, he accepted a new job in California last March. I have since met the acting director and president. They agreed to discuss it with their Board. I will get back with them this week. We are also working with the Parma Club to explore the possibility of starting a Noon club for Spring Arbor. If any club believes there is a community we should be looking at for a club, please let me know.

CYBER CLUB INVESTIGATION - There is a Cyber Lions Club in Grand Rapids that I would like to benchmark. If we believe that there is an opportunity for a Cyber Club in the District, we will put together an exploratory meeting.

6. HAVE FUN!

Sometimes you have to dig a lot of holes to find a new well. If you help the district "dig some holes", I am convinced we can increase membership and provide more service to our communities and the world. I am asking all of you to provide support of these initiatives. Thank you all for being Lions and for what you do for your communities and world. I am looking forward to meeting all of you when I visit the clubs this year!

On the previous evening PDG Craig Bishop (with his faithful companion Lucy) and incoming President Diane Klecker marched in the festival parade.




This was a joint project with B.C. Cereal City. We enjoyed working together. B.C. Host helped sponsor the Lions Air Force which were a real hit with the crowds.




BATTLE CREEK HOST




LONGEST BREAKFAST TABLE







By joining with Kiwanis on the Show Voucher Program, we will be able to provide shoe vouchers for 30 McCullough School students in addition to our existing Clothes Closet program. We were enthusiastically received by the Kiwanis Club, and I'm sure this will be an ongoing program. Michele is to be commended for taking the ball and getting this fine addition to our existing efforts.

The Manchester Lions used the SPOT cameras to screen the entire school system, screening 306 high school students in 1½ hours, 307 middle school students in 2 hours, and Klager Elementary school 324 students in conjunction with the Kiwanis "Kids Against Hunger." Screening 937 students total, finding 19 who referred. We also found 13 students who referred, and already had glasses but *left them at home*. Also sold Vidalia onions at the Farmer's Market, and participated in the Manchester Community Fair Parade, along with the Napoleon Lions Community Band.

The Marshall Lions report a successful onion sale with \$2000 raised, and another \$900 raised with a candy day sale.

The North Jackson Lions report: The North Jackson Lions Club participated in the RAP program by distributing approximately 140 books to children at the Kids Fest community service project June 22, 2016. NEW DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S PIN

The theme of the new District Governor's pin is growth and I thought that the best symbol of continuous growth is the Tree of Life.

According to the Bible there were two trees in the Garden of Eden, the Tree of Wisdom and the Tree of Life. The Tree of Life first appeared in Genesis 2:9 and 3:22-24 as the source of eternal life and continuous GROWTH in the Garden of Eden. The Tree of Life is represented in all major religions to include Christianity, Judaism, Buddhism, Muslim, and Hindu religions,

At the base of the pin are the words OPPORTUNITY, GROWTH and SERVICE. The top roots of the tree represent a hand pointing in opposite directions. This symbolizes the choice each Lion makes to offer the OPPORTUNITY to someone to SERVE their community as a Lion which will result in our GROWTH.

The eagle below the branches of the tree is a modified insignia for the rank of Colonel in the U.S. Army. The current insignia for the rank of Colonel is a silver eagle with the beak above the olive branch in the eagle's talons. Until 1851 Infantry colonels wore a gold eagle insignia and all other branches had silver eagle insignia. Prior to and during WWII the colonel eagle insignia was changed so that the beak faced the arrows held in the talons. This colonel insignia was called a War Eagle and was de-authorized for uniforms in 1951. The insignia on the pin represents that I was commissioned as an Infantry Officer and I had the privilege to serve our country in Iraq as a colonel.
