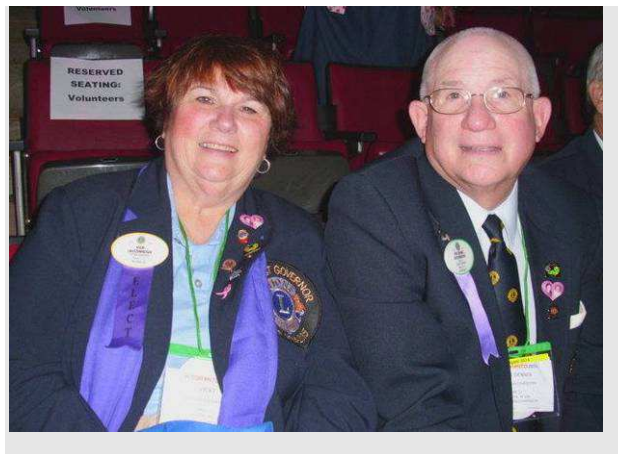
From the Governor

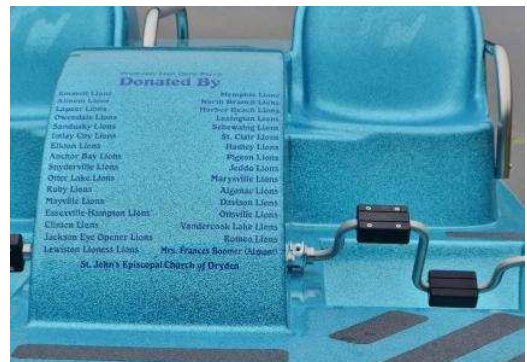
11-D2 Emmet Lions Deliver Paddle Boat to Bear Lake PDG Chuck Belesky, 11-D2

More North Jackson News: Lion Peg & Bob Griggs Civil War Update

This year, on the 21st of May, Lion Bob Griggs from the North Jackson Club did something that he hasn't done since school: he took a "field trip". Thanks to the James B. Brainerd GAR (Grand Army of the Republic) Memorial Hall and Museum, some of their volunteers, and the City of Eaton Rapids, the Austin Blair Camp 7 Group was able to hold the annual Civil War Day for the Paragon School of Jackson at the Museum and GAR Park in Eaton Rapids, MI.

The students, teachers, and chaperones were divided into two groups with one group going through the museum, while the other group went to GAR Park. Everyone got together for lunch and afterwards, the groups were reversed so everyone had a chance to see and learn about both locations.

At the park they learned about how a soldier would have lived during the Civil War as well as the equipment he would have carried with him, the role women played, how to treat a wounded soldier, and the part the drummer boys had. To get a better understanding of what a soldier went through - the 2nd day of the Battle of Shiloh was re-enacted by the students.

At the museum, they learned about the history of the Grand Army of the Republic and their Allied Orders, how their meetings were held, and the role that the GAR took after the war. They also got to see many items on display from the GAR - as well as the different Allied Orders - and learn about them.

Many thanks the GAR Memorial Hall, their staff, the City of Eaton Rapids as well as the teachers and chaperones who all worked together and allowed us to make this possible!

Jackson Cascades Lions Learn About Jackson Area Career Center

We had two guests from the Jackson Area Career Center to tell us about the JAC3 programs. Dan Draper, the Assistant Principal at the JACC, was introduced by Cindy Lyons, the Career Preparation Coordinator. The Career Center has about 1,200 students enrolled in 22 programs. Eleventh and twelfth grade students spend part time in their own high school and part time at the CC training for a career in a trade that is sorely needed. This training is funded by property taxes. As Cindy said in her opening remarks, "Trades are back".



The JAC3 program is unique to Michigan and maybe even to the entire country. They accept 20 new students in the program each year and add a 13th grade with classes held at Jackson College - that is up to 60 students at any one time. They have an acronym for the program: JAC3=E/MC. The complete official name of the program is The Jackson Area College and Career Connection (that's the JAC3) Early/Middle College (and that is the E/MC).

Students enter the program during their junior year of high school, are sponsored by a company and are expected to be finished at the end of three years. It will require attending evening and summer classes. They will then have earned their high school diploma from their home district, up to 64 credit hours (an Associate Degree) certified through local college programs, and a technical certification - with no costs for the student or their families. Upon graduation they will be guaranteed a job and have zero student debt!

It is a collaborative effort between educators and industry. Jackson has taken the lead with this model for technical training and it is little wonder that other schools are looking here for direction to create similar programs. Students not qualified to participate in the JAC3 program can still receive similar training without the 13th grade and job guarantee.

Vandercook Lake Lion Dave Hill to Become Zone Chair & 1VDG!

Whether he leapt to the opportunity...or cracked to the pressure (grin)...looks like VCL Lion Dave Hill, current Club President, has risen to the call and will assume a dual role this coming year as the Region 2 Zone 2 Chair and the 1VDG for the District.
