
#### WHAT SHALL I GIVE MY FRIENDS FOR CHRISTMAS


#### MEET THE NEW COUNCIL CHAIR ELECT for 2017-2018



#### PENRICKTON CENTER FOR BLIND CHILDREN - KICK OFF DINNER








## Hearing & Speech Improvement Program


