Hello Lions,

LCI's 31st Peace Poster and Peace Essay Contest Kits are now available. This year's theme is Kindness Matters. The contest is open to all young persons who will be 11, 12 or 13 on November 15, 2018 and is part of a school or Lions recognized program.

Along with the peace Poster Contest, each year the Lions also offers a Peace Essay Contest for young people who have a vision disability. This gives young people with a vision disability an opportunity to express their creativity and feelings about Peace. Participants in the Peace Essay Contest do not need to belong to a Lions recognized program or school.

The Peace Essay Contest is open to any student who meets the age and visual disability requirements. Lions and Lions Clubs are encourage, to locate young people, with a vision disability, in communities, schools and in families, to offer them the opportunity to participate in the Peace Essay Contest.



"Individuals must have acuities of 20/70 or less in the best eye, with best correction; or must have a visual field loss of 40 degrees or less in the best eye to be eligible for Youth Low Vision

services." and to be considered to have a vision disability.

Lions must purchase a Peace Poster Kit for each Peace Poster Contest they sponsor. One kit per school or group. Each winning poster submitted must have a sticker on the back to be accepted. Each kits come with the following:

Official Club Contest Guide and Rules

Official School or Youth Group Contest Guide and Rules

Participant Flyer to duplicate and give to participating students to take home

Sticker to place on back of winning poster

Certificates for contest winner and school or youth group

Rules for the Peace Essay Contest







While we do not have a final profit number, Chairman Bob Ward thinks



We thank Lakeview High School for use of the building and the two ladies who wor



DIABETES

You may have heard people say that they are "pre-diabetic" or that they have a "touch of diabetes" or that their sugar may be a "little high". These words suggest that diabetes isn't a serious disease. This is false. Diabetes is serious. However, a person can educate themselves to learn how to manage the disease.

People with diabetes need to educate themselves by reading Nutrition Facts labels found on almost every packaged food made in the United States. A person with diabetes can use the information found on the label to compare foods and make better choices.

START WITH THE SERVING INFORMATION AT THE TOP OF THE LABEL. This will tell you the size of a single serving and the total number of servings per container (package).

CHECK CALORIES PER SERVING. Understand how many calories are in the serving and how many servings your really eating if you eat the whole package. If you double the servings you eat, you double the calories and nutrients.

LIMIT THE NUTRIENTS. Limit the amount of saturated fat and sodium you eat. Choose foods with less of these nutrients when possible.

GET ENOUGH OF THESE NUTRIENTS. Verify that you get enough fiber, protein, calcium, iron, vitamins and other nutrients each day

QUICK GUIDE TO % DAILY VALUE. The % Daily Value (DV) tells you the percentage of each nutrient in a single serving, in terms of the daily recommended amount. As a guide, if you want to consume less of a nutrient (such as saturated fat or sodium), choose foods with a lower %DV (5% or less). If you want to consume more of a nutrient (such as fiber), seek foods with a higher % DV (20% or more).

Learn how to count CARBOHYDRATES. Protein and fat are a factor in diabetes but have less of an impact on blood glucose

Any diabetic dietician will stress the amount of carbohydrates taken in a meal. Carbohydrates are sugarbased molecules found in fruit, vegetables, whole grains and dairy products. 90% of carbohydrates digested end up as glucose, so they have a much bigger impact on blood sugar than fat or protein.

Look at how much carbohydrate is in the portion you plan to eat. The two items on the label that are most useful are the serving size and the total carbohydrate amount.

One serving of carbohydrate is measured as **15 grams**. A food that contains 15 games of carbohydrate is called "one carb serving". If 2 or 3 servings are eaten, then double or triple the information on the label. Find the right balance of carbohydrates, calories and portions.

Carb counting sounds complex but with time, a person can find the right balance.

The club decided to repeat their Valentine day project for the third year, which is preparing a valentine package for the entire student body and staff at the middle school.


