Special community interests have included serving as Committee Chairperson for the Boy Scout Cub Pack, and as both Boy Scout troop leader and as a Girl Scout troop leader during his son's path to become an Eagle Scout and his daughter's path to achieve her Girl Scout Gold Award. He also coached baseball in the Warrenton Khoury League. He has served several terms of office as an Alderman for the City of Warrenton, MO, and continues in that capacity today.

Lion Clark is retired from owning and operating Big B Truck Lines for 30 years. He and his wife, Mary Jane, have two children who are grown and married and two grandchildren.
