January is National Glaucoma Awareness Month

More than 46,000 Missourians suffer from this degenerative disease that damages vision and quality of life, yet only half of them know they have it. As the second-leading cause of blindness in the world, glaucoma gradually depletes vision as elevated pressure within the eye damages the optic nerve. If left undetected, the pressure continues to build, causing its sufferers to slowly lose their peripheral (side) vision until they become completely blind. Once vision has been lost to glaucoma, it cannot be regained. Saving Sight offers free Healthy Vision Screenings around the state to help identify people with glaucoma so they can get treatment. Through early detection and the help of medications and/or surgery, glaucoma can be slowed or even halted altogether.

Although anyone can be a victim of glaucoma, some people are at higher risk, according to the National Eye Institute:

- African Americans over the age of 40
- Everyone over the age of 60, especially Mexican Americans
- People with a family history of glaucoma
- People with diabetes or high blood pressure

Saving Sight is offering Healthy Vision Screenings around the state this January to celebrate National Glaucoma Awareness Month. Missouri Lions Hearing Conservation:

The purpose is to promote interest of the Lions clubs in the state in activities with relation to hearing conservation and assistance to deaf people. A major activity for the Lions Clubs in Missouri by which they support mobile hearing screening is through donations from the annual <u>Hearing Sweepstakes.</u> Two hearing screening vans are available to share throughout the state and two portable machines in each Missouri Lion District. Lions also provide free or low cost hearing aids to the needy, collect used hearing aids for recycle and provide hearing education programs. The State Hearing Committee consists of District Chairs that meet quarterly. The Hearing Sweepstakes tickets are available starting in February with a drawing held at the district convention in March and Grand Prize Drawing at the State Convention. Free hearing screenings are made available to the public. Each district is given use of screening vans to share with clubs various times throughout the year for screenings in your community.

Let's work together to make this holiday season a little brighter for someone in need.


Fellow Lion in Need

Sight for Kids Changes Bhavani's Life

With 12.8 million children visually impaired due to <u>uncorrected</u> <u>refractive error</u> (URE) in Southeast Asia, it isn't surprising that S. Bhavani was diagnosed with myopia (nearsightedness). In children, URE is especially devastating because poor vision at a young age can impede their ability to learn.

The LCIF and Johnson & Johnson Vision Care <u>Sight for Kids</u> (SFK) program provides much needed eye health education and conducts



school-based visual screening for underserved children in cities across Asia. The program also provides referrals to professional eye care for eyeglasses and surgery. It is through this program that Bhavani received a vision screening and a referral for his myopia.



It was at the L. V. Prasad Eye Institute in Hyderabad, India, that Bhavani received the follow up care he needed, including free eyeglasses provided through SFK. Now, Bhavani is reading well and participates in extracurricular activities. He also has great aspirations for his future: "I am so happy and confident. Now with this pair of spectacles, I am able to do all my activities without any difficulty. My thanks to you," said Bhavani. "I will become a doctor, helping my parents and society."
