The Diabetes Initiative: Lions Impacting Lives

It is estimated that 415 million people are living with diabetes in the world, which is estimated to be 1 in 11 of the world's adult population¹. Of this number 3.4 million/9.3% people in Canada², and 29.1 million people/9.3% people in the United States³ have diabetes. A frightening statistic is that 46% of people with diabetes are undiagnosed¹.

According to the Mayo Clinic "Long-term complications of diabetes develop gradually. The longer you have diabetes — and the less controlled your blood sugar — the higher the risk of complications. Eventually, diabetes complications may be disabling or even life-threatening. Possible complications include: Eye damage (Retinopathy), Cardiovascular Disease, Nerve damage (Neuropathy). Kidney damage (Nephropathy), Foot damage, Skin conditions, Hearing impairment, and Alzheimer's disease⁴".

Lions understand that people with diabetes often face life-threatening difficulties and know

that tremendous need exists to help them. Lions International recently introduced a new global service framework with diabetes being one of its primary focuses.

Members of the USA/Canada Forum planning committee believe that Lions will have a desire to serve people who are impacted by this devastating illness. In response to this the forum planning committee decided to include a program on diabetes in its offerings. They invited the Diabetes Education and Camping Association to host this program.

The Diabetes Education and Camping Association will help launch "Diabetes" as a new global service of Lions International. We have recruited a committee of diabetes professionals, led by Committee Chairperson PID Dr. Gary Anderson, to plan a diabetes symposium which will take place during the forum on Thursday morning, September 21st. Tentative session topics include:

- Introduction to Diabetes
- Diabetes Treatment Methodologies
- Complications of Diabetes - including How

Diabetes Affects Vision

- Procedures for Treating Complications of Diabetes
- Educating Patients In Effective Diabetes Management
- Diabetes Camps
- Diabetes Research Updates

I invite you to join us at "The Diabetes Initiative" to learn what diabetes is, how it is treated, how people with this illness are impacted and what you can do to help them live healthier, happier and more productive lives. I look forward to seeing you there!

Lions clubs are composed of diverse people in communities in nearly every corner of the world. That's why we offer you several ways to become a Lion – and serve. Lions clubs offer volunteer programs for college students, kids, adults and families.

- **Regular Membership:** Are you interested in volunteer programs, community service and making our world a better place? Lions Clubs International (LCI) offers community members the opportunity to volunteer locally together as a group. Members are expected to meet membership requirements such as dues set by the club and LCI. Take the first step toward membership today – contact a local club and ask to be invited to a meeting.
- **Family Membership:** Looking for special volunteer programs and activities you can do with your family? Family membership allows relatives to volunteer together at a reduced dues rate. Family members must meet membership requirements, live in the same household and belong to the same club. Children cannot become members, but can participate in the Cub Program, which allows children under age 12 the opportunity to build a lifelong dedication to helping others. If more than one member of your family is joining a club, tell them you want to join as a family unit.
