Some Ideas for New Member Recruitment

An important consideration when looking for new members is that some people have very little time to commit to meetings and could be discouraged from joining if meetings are a requirement. **Remember that LCI no longer has an attendance requirement and it is no longer a reason for dropping a member.** While meeting attendance is always desired, it is certainly not mandatory – a "minimum participation goal" should be to get members to provide their ideas and input via phone, email, or in person; try to be involved in at least one or two of your annual activities; and to pay their dues.

A solid recruiting plan looks like this:

- 1. General Public Relations / Marketing Tasks:
 - a. **Develop/Revise your Lions Club brochure.** This is should include pictures and information on your club and events and someone's contact information.
 - b. **Develop/Revise your Lions Club website**. **Note:** there will be a fee to purchase a domain name and hosting package if you don't use the free website offered by LCI.
 - c. **Develop/Revise your Lions Club Social Media Sites**. Make sure you have a Facebook page at a minimum. Facebook is the largest social media site, and the ideal demographic for our clubs.
 - d. Use your local Community TV. Local Community TV studios are always looking for local programming. Reach out to them an ask about doing a half-hour TV show or filming your events. They may not have the personnel to provide, but they will train you on the equipment and you will gain a new skill...and have fun doing it.
 - e. **Design a business card for your Lions Club** with basic contact info and your Facebook page and website info. All members could be given some of these cards to handout whenever needed. Some clubs have developed a business card offering a free dinner at a meeting that is handed out to prospective members.
 - f. **Design a postcard dinner invitation.** Reach out to your community "Welcome Wagon" who sends information on your town to new people who move in. Make sure it has your current meeting location and time, and a contact.
 - g. Arrange for a Lions Club information table at all public town events including road races, elections, town meetings, sporting events and as an option you can give out water or coffee or snacks. Always have Club brochures, bookmarks, member applications and informational displays/materials.
 - h. Send a press release and photos about EVERYTHING your club does. Your local daily/weekly/monthly newspapers are always looking for this kind of information, and often use it as filler for empty space when laying out their paper. They also may have an online calendar and will post your events there. Press is FREE!
- 2. Develop a "canned pitch" or "bulleted checklist" of information to be shared about LCI, your Lions Club, and the work you do. This should be given to all of our members for use anytime they are discussing the Lions so our message is complete and consistent by all members.

3. Divide and Conquer! Approach Various Town Entities for Representation in your Club

We strongly suggested that various town entities could/should be a part of the Lions, which would provide a win-win for both your club and their organization as information is shared and input is provided on planned activities. Below is the list of entities identified; add others that you see in your community. Next, add in the name of the suggested point of contact, and then please assign a Lion member to take on the assignment.

IMPORTANT: <u>FIRST</u> develop the "canned pitch" or "bulleted checklist" of information to be shared about LCI, your Lions Club, and the work you do, so your message is complete and consistent by all members. The District can help you with this. (See #2)

- 4. Conduct Informational Meetings about YOUR Lions Club, LCI, etc. to which each member invites 1-2 people to attend. Serve coffee and pastry, if morning; a light lunch, if daytime; or wine and hors d'oeuvres, if evening. Try to hold 2 "open meetings" a year to serve as the informational meetings. Invite the public to attend your meeting and see what they're like. The District can help you get speakers for your meetings.
- 5. Always wear your Lions pin and wear your club shirt as often as possible. Doing so promotes conversation and can often result in meeting fellow Lions from other towns or getting a new member. You might be surprised at how many people will ask you what the "L" stands for! Use the "canned pitch" you developed in number 2 for talking points.

As always, the leadership of the District is here to help your Club succeed. Please reach out to any one of us and we will help you with growing your club. More members = more service!

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all of you a happy, healthy, and safe holiday season. Thank you for all you do to make your communities a better place to live. Many of you were at the last Cabinet Advisory Meeting where I spoke briefly about the Helen Keller Award. The award was established in 2014 in honor of Helen Keller, who inspired Lions to be her "knights of the blind". She asked that they work to help find a cure for preventable blindness. The award is for an individual who has accomplished outstanding humanitarian service to the community. The individual can only be recommended by a club or individual lion other than themselves. The recipient receives a letter, plaque, and drape ribbon in recognition of their dedicated humanitarian service from the District 33-S Governor and the Helen Keller Service Award Committee/LCIF Chairperson. The Lions club or individuals are asked to donate \$250.00 to the District 33-S Helen Keller Service Award Program. The money, other than the cost of the award, is put into the District 33-S account. Once there is \$1000.00 the money is sent to LCIF for a Melvin Jones. Each District Governor then has the ability to give a Melvin Jones to an individual that they believe is deserving of a Melvin but in a club that does not have the means to give out an award themselves. Recommendations for deserving individuals are given to the District Governor by the Helen Keller Committee. In the end it is ultimately up to the Governor when making the award.


