Research studies estimate that there may be as many as five million Americans living with low vision today.

Low vision is a chronic and disabling visual impairment that cannot be corrected with eyeglasses, medication or surgery. Most cases of low vision are due to age-related causes such as age-related macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma. 80% of individuals with low vision are over the age of 65. For children and young adults, inherited eye disease is the leading cause of low vision. As the American population ages, the number of people coping with low vision will only grow.

Fortunately, for those coping with low vision and vision loss, Low Vision Rehabilitation is greatly effective in giving them the skills, ability, and confidence to function effectively in their everyday life.

The Massachusetts Lions Low Vision Rehabilitation Network [MA-LOVRNET] is an initiative of the Lions of Massachusetts to identify and to link resources to help individuals who are coping with low vision and vision loss.

MA-LOVRNET is a cooperative network of optometrists, ophthalmologists, occupational therapists, rehabilitation therapists, mobility specialists, health and social service providers, professionals and volunteers that aims to reduce the barriers to receiving appropriate and beneficial low vision rehabilitation services by those who would benefit from them.

Through a process of identification, evaluation, referral, recommendation and follow-up, individuals are guided through what can be a labyrinth of care and service opportunities.

The Lions of Massachusetts provide the community-based contact and support services to enable individuals to take advantage of the network resources.

Through education, the use of adaptive devices or visual aids and the development of skills, people with low vision and vision loss can continue to lead an active life and continue with their daily activities.



The LIONS of Massachusetts provide the essential component to making MA-LOVRNET function effectively and to reducing the barriers to assisting those with low vision.

The LIONS' vision, community involvement, outreach, education, coordination and support services make MA-LOVRNET possible.

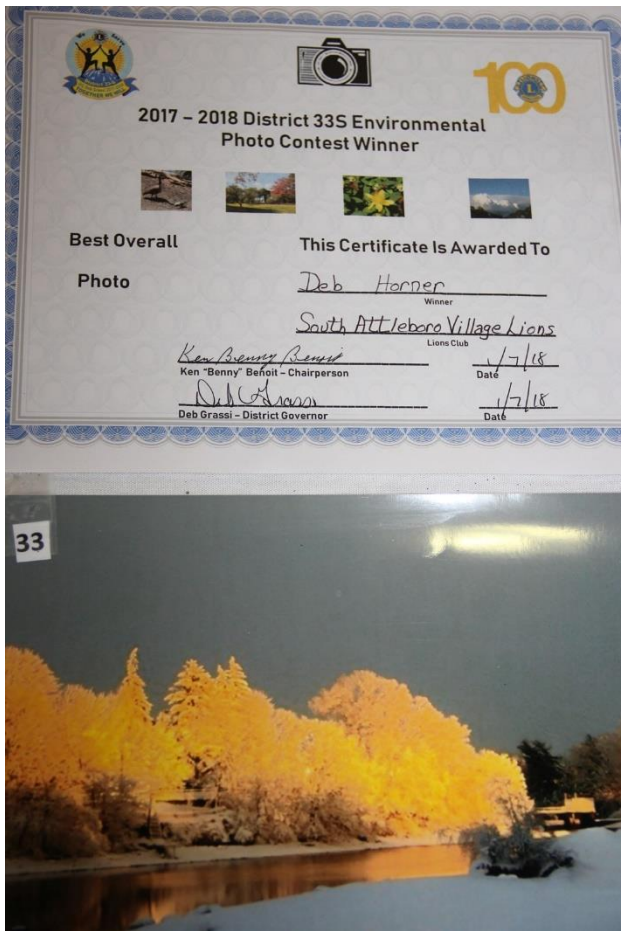
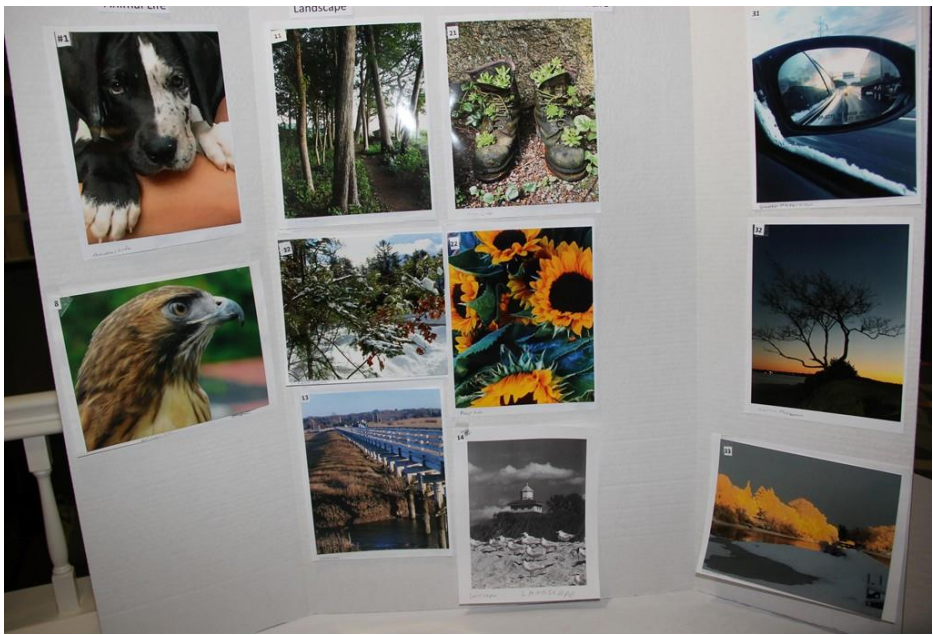

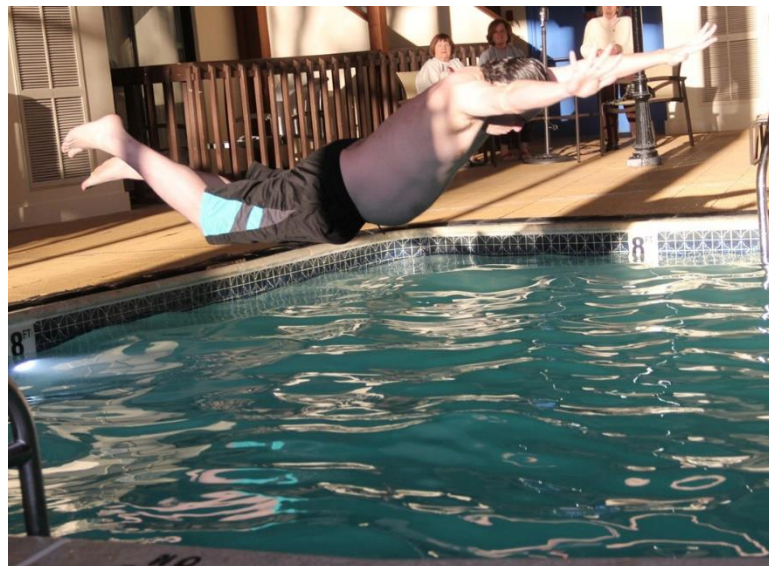

LIONS YOUTH SPEECH CONTEST

SUGGESTED PROCEDURE FOR RUNNING A LOCAL CONTEST

2017-2018 topic: “What is the impact of Volunteerism?”

1. Get local Lions club support including authorization of some prize money (Sept)
2. Contact local high school Principal through an introductory letter (see below) outlining eligibility, nature and purpose of the contest. Copy to school superintendent. Offer to follow up the letter in a few days with a phone call. (late Sept)
3. Soon after letter, call the high school Principal and arrange to promote the contest to students in the eligible grades. Set date for promotion and date for contest. Promotion could be at an assembly or by visiting English classes. Alternatively, make flyers and ask school to post them in halls and in English classes. Stress the extracurricular and non-mandatory nature of the activity. (Sept – October)
4. Promote the contest to eligible students in person or by flyers. In either case, make flyers as a reminder and ask school to post them in halls and in English classes. (Sept – Oct.)
5. Contact next level coordinator to let them know your club is participating and to find the date of the zone or regional contest. (October)
6. Arrange for judges to judge the contest. Remember no Lions and no HS staff may judge. (October)
7. Hold the contest for eligible students. Normally, location is at the HS after school. Pay prize money at contest. Let winner know date of next contest.

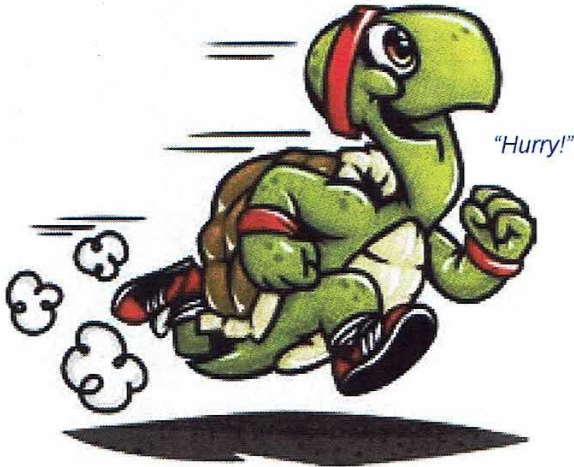
