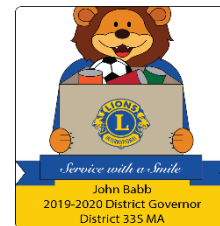

Message from District Governor John Babb



April 2020 Newsletter

NOTE: The Massachusetts Lions State Convention has been cancelled, originally scheduled 24-26 April. We will continue to monitor the opportunity to possibly hold a 1-day meeting at a later date. District elections (including our Council Secretary election) will be held by our District Elections Committee - more details to follow from myself and CST Jane Puccio.

Greetings District 335 Lions. I hope that this letter finds you healthy and happy. If not, please let us know so we can help (Club or District Officers are here to help).

Wow! What a difference a few days makes. What a challenging time we are currently living. As Lions, "We Serve"! In this trying and scary world, we can make a difference in people's lives. Reach out to your neighbors and community. What can you, and your Lions' or Leos' Club, do to help. Deliver food, deliver toilet paper, deliver pet supplies, deliver medicine, purchase needed supplies, transportation to medical appointments, etc. I was asked at my last visitation (might be my last for my DG year), how this emergency might impact fund-raising and donations. My response was, and will always be, to take care of your family, friends, and community first. They have needs. If your Club has charity funds, then they might just be best used helping your community. Again, in a recurring theme for me, please let me know how I can help. Remember those establishments that have always donated to your Club's activities (restaurants, banks, retail), as they may be experiencing hard-times. Remember to buy take-out from your local restaurants, so that they can weather this storm. Care for those around you!

We had our 3rd Cabinet Advisory Meeting on 9 March at the Raynham Lions Hall. Our surprise guest was Lions Club International President Jung-Yul Choi and his wife Seung-Bok. President Choi is "trapped" in the US, as he comes from South Korea. If he goes home, then he likely would not be coming back to the US for a while. That led to an opportunity for IP Choi and his wife to visit us for our Advisory Meeting. It was an excellent night, and IP Choi had a very motivational speech. Thanks for all who attended - I hope that you enjoyed the opportunity. Thanks again to the Raynham Lions Club for a delicious meal. Thanks to PID Joyce and 2VDG Martin Middleton for handling logistics for the visit.

NOTE: IP Choi had been in the country for several weeks prior to his visit, and we therefore agreed to the visit, since the risks were low.

3 days later, CST Jane Puccio and I discussed how different the world had become. Other Districts started cancelling their Advisory meetings, and clubs started cancelling their fund-raising and service events. There is no doubt that if our Advisory meeting had been a week later, we would have been forced to cancel it. The cancellations and postponements were/are the right decision, as the risk of COVID-19 exposure increases with density of people. We may still only be at the leading edge of exposures. I'm hoping that we emerge from the other side of this pandemic, with healthy Lions and communities, with a desire for Pancake breakfasts, Comedy shows, Bake Sales and Craft Fairs - and possibly an appetite for cruise ship raffles. Whether they have money to spend might be challenging if many are out of work for a time.

I have visited 44 of our 49 Lions' Clubs, and have yet to visit a Leos' Club. It is likely that my visits will consist of phone calls with Club officers and members, since group meetings are prohibited by the State of Massachusetts. I have invested in a WebEx phone bridge service, and have used that to good effect for District Officer meetings, so far this year. Stay tuned. I do want to complete the year with discussions with all of the Lions' and Leos' Clubs. Leos' may be the hardest to meet with, since schools are not in session, pending a later State or Community decision.

Regards District (and Council Secretary) elections: I will form an elections committee, and we will hold District elections (likely on or about 26 April), most likely via a web-based service. Email and postal mail are alternatives. Lions Clubs will still need to nominate their delegates, and provide email and phone contact for those delegates. CST Jane will send details when available. We also have an Eyemobile Charter revision to vote on for our District. Some Massachusetts Multiple District information was provided in CST Jane's prior email and mailings to your Club Presidents and Secretaries. This State business will be handled separately from the District elections - likely later this year.

Please don't forget your Club membership growth efforts as we navigate this National and State emergency. Your local service to others could be your hallmark that leads to membership gains. The fact that we are a "Service" organization, with a healthy National and International footprint sets us from other civic groups. We have on-line resources for training, collaboration, reporting, etc. Again, please let your District Officers know if we can help.

I thank-you for your efforts and your dedication. Remember to have fun, but most importantly - please be safe!

When submitting an application for hearing assistance please be sure to use the **MOST RESENT** application that is posted online at District33S.org. This will prevent delays in processing application.

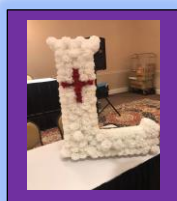
